And now to the business at hand. Firstly, the election run-down. At 6:00 pm (Los Angeles time) on Wednesday, Dec. 31 (a bit before we were going off to party), Robbie called Nick Stathopoulos (as pre-arranged) and commenced counting the DUFF ballots. I got home from work during the counting of the third runthrough.

160 fans cast ballots with the North American administrators, 32 fans cast ballots with the Australasian administrators. The following two tables are included to show the following information: table one shows the break-down of the voting by geographic area, table two shows the break-down of the voting through the 4 run-throughs necessary to produce a winner. 
