PAOCEDURES FOR CHECKING OUT OF BUILDING 4SJ

KITCHEN:

Be sure the rear door is locked by the dead bolt, the only lock that is operational. Check the door to be certain. Be sure the refrigerator is set at normal and closed tightly. Coffee machine must be turned off. You probably should dump out the excess coffee.

Turn out the light.

MIDDLE ROOM:

Turn off the heater by the thermostat on the wall near the phone room. Turn out the light above the thermostat.

Do not turn off the heater by raising the grille and fooling around with the controls underneath.

Turn off the light in the phone room.

Turn out the room light (near bathroom door).

BATHROOM:

Turn out the light.

NON-SMOKING LOUNGE:

The light for this room is by the front door of the building.

ENTRANCE ROOM:

There are two light switches to turn off, one by the door to the middle room, and a set of four by the front door. Be sure all are switched off.

Lock the door on your way out -- but first check everything again. Test the front door once you're outside to be sure it is locked securely. The dead bolt high up on the door is the only lock that works.

LIBRARY:

Few will have occasion to bother with this room. Here the closet door must be closed and locked, the light be turned out, and the entrance door closed and locked.

Special instructions for card players: return the folding chairs to the meeting room (you can leave 4 or 5 in Bldg. 4SJ); return any borrowed card tables to their usual locations. Put the wooden table in the middle room back against the wall. Put away cards.

Unless they are full to overflowing, don't bother about emptying the ash trays or waste baskets. However, please toss all your empty goody bags, beverage cans and other noisome hunks of garbage into the appropriate containers.

It's trite, but true to say that this is your clubhouse so treat it like your home. But some of you may be slobs at home, so please treat this place a little better than you would your own hovel/mansion.

Basic rule for both buildings: If you are the last person out, all of this procedure is your responsibility alone. Do not rely on anyone else's word that this closing procedure has been done properly, because if it hasn't, you'll lose last-person-out privileges (such as they are). Always double-check everything that needs to be done. DE PROF 104, p. 3.

PROCEDURES FOR CHECKING OUT OF FREEHAFER HALL

APA-L ROOM:

If you've been using the mimeo, fold it up and cover it. Be sure all the controls are returned to their at-rest positions, especially the feed lever. It's a good idea to leave your last stencil on the drum; it keeps the ink from drying out somewhat.

Lock the rear door. Check it. Be sure the window is latched. Turn out the light.

BATHROOM:

Be sure the window is latehod. Check it. Turn out the light.
Turn out the hall light.

MEETING ROOM:

Be sure the emergency exit is locked. Turn off the amplifier.

If the chairs have been put in disarray, put them back more or less where they go, but you don't have to be overly tidy about this.

Be sure the fron and back windwos are locked. Check them. There's a small portable heater somewhere around. Turn it off and, preferably, unplug it. Lock the door as you leave.

Note: if you're alone at the clubhouse or in the back building, you'll probably want the auxiliary telephone bell turned on. (It's near the rear window of Freehafer Hall.)

THE SHEDS:

If you've had occasion to open them, be sure that they are closed and locked when you leave.

In general, you don't have to worry about emptying the garbage cans, unless they are nearing a critical overload. That will generally be done by the Maintenance Committee. But please toss all garbage lying around into the cans. Don't put out cigarettes on the floor; someday we'll have carpets and habits are hard to break.

Special rain note: the waterspout that is at this time (Jan. '79) precariously perched on the antenna outside the entrance to the meeting room <u>must</u> remain there. It hooks underneath the electrical conduit on the roof to convey water away from the area immediately in front of the door. If this is not done, the water will flow under the door into the building and make a hell of a mess.

BASIC RULE FOR BOTH BUILDINGS: If you are the last person out, all of this procedure is your responsibility alone. Do not rely on the word of anyone else that this closing procedure has been done properly, because if it hasn't, you'll lose last-person-out privileges (such as they are). Always double-check everything that needs to be done.

Card players: Put the chairs back where they go: put the tables back where they go, too.


FAPA will be collated next on Mother's Day, at the clubhouse.
