Meeting No. 2313, December 10, 1981

Meeting No. 2314, December 17, 1981

The meeting was called to order at 8:10. Guests introduced were Tim Conner, S. S. Ryder, Ken Schwarz, Wanda Ross, Annette Smith and Sandra Smith. The minutes were modified and approved. St. Fred was honored with three cheers. All four parking spaces were auctioned L. E. W. Gray (\$10.00), F. Gasperik (\$8.22), L. Moffatt (\$10.00) and J. Copeland (\$9.00) Milt Stevens reported that one bid has been received for Loscon 10 (1983), naming Bruce Pelz as chair. Other bids may be submitted until the next Board meeting on January 17th, 1982. The club will then vote on the bids. The treasurer announced that yearly dues may be paid any time before the end of March, and that the next two meetings would be free.
