LASFS Board of Directors Meeting Sunday, March 11, 2007 Karl Lembke, Presiding George Van Wagner, Scribe

The meeting was called to order at 11:10 am

Minutes: Approved as submitted.

New Members: None.

Treasurer's Report: The budget was not present, but the treasurer brought two items before the board that needed to be acted on. First the person who has been cleaning the clubhouse will not be able to commit to weekly cleaning going forward, but to a thorough monthly cleaning instead. There have been no other bidders for the cleaning contract to date, perhaps because it hasn't been getting announced regularly at society meetings. It was moved that we provisionally extend the current agreement by three months and publicize the availability of the cleaning contract more vigorously to see if there are any other takers. The motion was approved unanimously.

Charles Lee Jackson II requested that the video rental budget be partially funded to get him through to the scheduled budget review in May. It was moved that we provisionally provide \$200 for the video rental budget. The motion was approved with a single abstention (Pelz).

Facilities: The air conditioner in 4SJ was repaired, a circuit breaker was also replaced (thanks to Scott Beckstead for that). There has been leakageover the computer room, due to leaf buildup blocking drainage.

There was mention that the dentist to the East had objected to the side door of Frehafer Hall being opened onto his property (to help air the building before one of the short story readings) on the basis of it being an emergency exit and there being no emergency. He also stated his willingness to call the authorities if people were to exit through that door with no actual emergency happening. In related matters, he has planted bushes in the strip next to his slab that is actual club property, and this could adversely affect drainage from our roof. It was moved that we retain Kris Wilson to evaluate the overall situation with the neighbor and make recommendations as to how we might resolve the situation. This motion passed unanimously.

The above led to a discussion of alternative emergency exits and the possibility of installing push bars on other doors. George Van Wagner volunteered to do some initial research on push bars and the installation thereof. It was moved that we remove the lock from the interior APA-L room door, to ease access to the exit on that side. The motion was approved unanimously.

There was then a wide-ranging discussion of club history, archives, paperwork, scanning, preservation, accumulation, and the complete-ist urge which lasted until the horse had been reduced to its elemental particles.

It was reported that someone, presumably a transient, had voided their bowels in the courtyard. This is the third time that this has happened in the past eight months.

There was a brief report from the Town Council committee concerning the recent meeting at which all special interest groups using society facilities had been informed of the obtaining of the umbrella license from the Motion Picture Licensing Corporation for video presentations.

There was discussion of establishing an official nonsmoking border outside the front door and/or what could be done to encourage smokers to be aware of smoke drift when the front door of Frehafer Hall is open for ventilation or other purposes. It was suggested that much of the problem might be solved by moving the ashtrays further away from the door.

The vending machine is on hold for the moment.

Gestetner: The start button and related circuit board have been replaced at a cost of \$195. The paying of tribute seems to have placated the spirits of duplication and the Gestetner is running smoothly.

A/V Systems: Brett Achorn reported that the committee to add a video server had come to the conclusion that,

until such time as an actual use for a video server is established beyond the sheer niftiness of being able to say "Hey, we have a video server", there is no current need for such an item and it would be a waste of the club's resources to configure a spare computer for that purpose at this time.

Library: Vanessa Van Wagner has volunteered to serve as club librarian to replace Greg Barrett, who has resigned from that position. Elayne Pelz, who has been the board's liason to the library, has offered to help with the transition, since the inventory is still ongoing. It was moved that we thank Vanessa for the offer and appoint her librarian before she changes her mind. This motion passed unanimously. It was then moved that the board send a letter of thanks to Greg Barrett for his stewardship of the library over the past couple of years. Inventory of the library is continuing with a projection of late May for completion and migration to the new library management software. Elayne and Vanessa are engaged in discussion of acquisition policy and proper allotment of the library budget. There is also a plan to establish more regular library hours.

Video Collection: An inventory is underway.

Marketing: The marketing committee is continuing to meet on third Wednesdays and is looking for new ways to promote the club. Any members interested in participating is encouraged to participate in these meetings. Ed Green expressed concern that the marketing committee was perhaps in need of some guidance from the board as to direction and focus, and that this was something that the board should open discussions on soon.

Website: The webmaster has requested content for updating the website, specifically the reading lists, bylaws, and standing rules of the society. The marketing committee requested the ability to be able to post material directly to an upcoming events page and the webmaster promised to look into that possibility. There was some discussion about the .org versus .info domains and how they can be consolidated.

Loscon 33: Closeout meeting is scheduled for Saturday, March 24th at noon. Officially the turnover from Loscon 33 was \$10,080.

Loscon 34: The first meeting was held and was well attended. Parties have been held at Condor and Gallifrey and will continue to be held at upcoming cons. PR 1 has been finished, and memberships are being bought. All seems on track and moving ahead. There will be the option to obtain Progress Reports electronically in an attempt to minimize the budgetary impact of the coming postage increase.

Loscon 35: It was announced that the winner of the bid for Loscon 35 was "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Loscon", headed by Cathy Beckstead and Joyce Hooper. The representative from Loscon 35 reports that planning is proceeding apace and according to schedule.

LaLaCon: The dates for LaLaCon have been set as June 22-24. The usual foolishness will happen, with the addition of a chocolate chip cookie contest.

Yard Sale: No date has been set as of yet, but there is an intention to throw a Yard Sale/Bake Sale.

Other Events: Charles Lee Jackson II proposed that the club schedule and publicize a series of seminars at the club in an attempt to leverage the talents and knowledge base of the club members.

Miscellaneous: It was noticed that tape was holding something to the whiteboard and mentioned that it should not be used there, as it can damage the board. CLIII mentioned that Terminix has been calling to schedule an inspection. This discussion was taken offline.

At this point a closed session was requested. It was moved that the board adopt a resolution to its own standing rules stating that the LASFS property is not a residence and that no person is permitted to stay on the property when the building is closed, nor store their personal belongings on the property without the express permission of the board of directors and procedural officers, said permission only to be granted in state of emergency. The resolution was approved with one abstention (Green).

It was moved that the April meeting of the Board of Directors be cancelled due to conflict with a Christian religious holiday.
