Board Meeting

June 11, 2023 Michelle Pincus, chairing Susan Fox, Secretary

Call to Order

Called to order at 11:02 a.m.

Present

Chairman Michelle Pincus, Vice Chairman Nick Smith, Secretary Susan Fox, Eylat Poliner, Gavin Claypool, Elayne Pelz, Christian B. McGuire, Rob "Gizmo" Powell, Cathy Johnson, Dean Johnson, and Heide Nichols. Non-board members: Webmistress Kristine Cherry, Loscon hotel coordinator Jason Justice, and club member observer Tony Benoun.

Agenda Items

The meeting started with Jason Justice offering an update on hotel negotiations and selection. We are well under way with negotiations with the Hilton Los Angeles Airport, the winning bid. He will present the current draft of the contract, but the hotel has agreed in principle with the additions. Sharing the desktop: A Group Sales Event Agreement for 2024 only. There will be three years of agreement in total with slight price increases.

We'll have a 300-room block, a conservative estimate. We should get more like 380 based on the previous year. Rates are \$145 for a single or double, \$155 for a triple, and \$165 for a quad. Sleeping rooms are broken down by type: king-sized bed, double, etc.

A highlight is that we don't have to pay any fees for meeting room rental. In exchange, we

have a food and beverage minimum. We can use our hospitality budget—\$14,000—on stuff we get from the hotel.

Eylat Poliner: Staff meal tickets instead of staff lounge. Also, an event to honor former Loscon chairs.

Justice: This gives each Loscon chair the latitude for creativity in their food event planning.

Michelle Pincus would like to discuss Loscon 49 events with Justice, also. Will take offline.

Poliner and Susan Fox will discuss Death By Chocolate and Fancy Tea events.

Justice will do what he can to negotiate the number down to \$10,000 in exchange for 350 room nights.

Dean Johnson: How comfortable are you with these numbers? Justice: *Very*. The food and beverage makes a great deal of difference to the hotel. If we come in under \$14,000, we pay the difference without taxes, etc. There's also a \$15 room night rebate.

Concessions: We don't get the Presidential Suite for free, but we do get it at the group rate.

We can seek up to three committee meetings per year with \$20 parking and free Wi-Fi for guest rooms. 20 extra free Wi-Fi codes for the function space for registration. 10 free parking passes. Tables and chairs in function spaces like dealers room, 30 sets of table and two chairs free. Stage furniture is free: risers, tables, chairs, etc.

They require a three-month notice if we wish to release any space. We probably won't.

There's a 50 percent discount if we need additional Wi-Fi access, including wired access for streaming and dealers for their payment methods. Nick Smith indicated that the Strategicon dealers had no problem with hot spots.

The rest of the language is pretty standard. Reservations need to be in by two weeks prior. Post-convention auditing is free if we give them the CSD by the end of the show. The rental cost is considered paid as long as we make 80 percent of the room nights. If we are short on food and beverage before the event, we pay the difference. OK. Book another lunch! Cancellation charges are standard and probably not an issue. A set of special conditions distinctive to fannish events: party floors, signage with non-marking tape, costumes.

By early next week, Justice hopes to have a final version of the Year One contract. Request to Christian B. McGuire for his eyes on the contract.

McGuire moves that we authorize Justice to have Elayne Pelz sign the contract when he is satisfied with the clauses that he is seeking. Moved, seconded, and accepted.

Thanks to Justice for all his work on this project.

30-Second Reports

Chairman (Michelle Pincus): No report

Vice Chairman (Nick Smith) is looking into the Westercon situation for 76. He's beginning to worry that one of their representatives is no longer on the Web site, and the hotel negotiations are still "pending."

Secretary (Susan Fox): May I please get the spreadsheet from the special meeting for discussing Loscon hotels, so I may complete their minutes, for completism? There is not much more to add except that we authorized Jason Justice to proceed with negotiations.

I need a reliable working email address for Nick Smith. Or else, please whitelist the domain Scifi.Radio. Smith's email bounced again this morning. Gmail works, though. Will send board communication via Gmail.

Comptroller (Gavin Claypool): The investment account value as of June 9, 2023, is \$791,210.42. We're up \$15,000 since May 31.
