Busby gave a presentation on the ALF, of which she's been president for seven years. The organization concentrates on preserving the NASA site in Downey—and the Columbia Memorial Space Center. The membership includes engineers who worked on the Apollo and shuttle programs, as well as others, and enthusiasts. The ALF also partners with Oasis, the local chapter of the National Space Society, and offers a speakers bureau for school and library programs. An active conrunner—Busby chaired Westercon 75 and runs programming for Loscon 49—she also spearheads the ALF's OuteRimCon, which will resume in 2024.

An engineering graduate from MIT, Spadoni worked for Hughes, TRW, and Northrop Grumman before retiring about 10 years ago. He now focuses on blending engineering and artwork with a small company called Aerospace Imagineering. His work has included jobs for Hot Wheels, Estes, video game developers, and consulting for Hollywood. He's worked on a dozen movies, including True Lies, Apollo 13, Titanic, Supernova, Stealth, and Iron Man. Spadoni also walked through several examples of artistic concepts focusing on mission-driven design, cruise ships and skyscrapers, vanity-driven design and helmet lights.

LASFS members asked questions about the role of a technical adviser, amateurs critiquing the accuracy of his artwork, and how changes in staff can affect ongoing projects.



According to Fancyclopedia 3, Klaus was one of the few members kicked out of the club over the course of its history. As reported in File 770 #33: "David K.M. Klaus became the third person in the history of the Los Angeles Science Fantasy Society to have his membership terminated when attendees ... voted 58-13 to expel him from the Society."

Greg Bridges for distribution at Pemmi-Con, this new iteration of *Memphen* is offered as a perzine rather than the clubzine for the Memphis Science Fiction Association (previously the Mid-South Fantasy Association).

Bridges informs readers of his wife's recovery from cancer and offers brief fanac bona fides before exploring the evolution of Memphis—and his—fandom over the course of several pages. One strong LASFS connection is that Jerry Pournelle grew up in Memphis and used to buy prozines at a newsstand next to a trolley stop before he left town for university.

Our humble faned and *De Prof* correspondent found fandom through the National Fantasy Fan Federation in the 1960s. That led to gatherings in another local member's home—and eventually the formation of the now-defunct Memphis Science Fiction Association. Bridges considers the club's newsletters, convention activity, and occasional efforts toward a Memphis Worldcon—including one organized by folks otherwise disconnected from local fen. (Methinks Garth Spencer would get a chuckle out of that situation.)
