Library (Gavin Claypool): The part of the library that was stored at Green Mountain has been moved to the Public Storage location with the rest of the library. Thank you, Cathy and Dean Johnson, and Christian B. McGuire for your help. Quartermaster (Heide Nichols): No report Archives (Cathy Johnson): The Green Mountain storage was culled of some file cabinets. We kept one with stuff. CD-ROMs were retained and will be examined for relevance and possible posting on the Web site if appropriate.

Physical Plant/Storage (Rob Powell): We're currently getting ready for Gallifrey One. Apologies for not attending Green Mountain yesterday. Elayne Pelz has a report on the visit to storage, delivered by Christian B. McGuire:

Yesterday, we met at 8 a.m. at the storage space. Seven big blocks have been reduced to four. McGuire, Pelz, Cathy and Dean Johnson, Gavin Claypool, and Heath Row attended. We emptied filing cabinets containing APA-L and fanzines. Row boxed and took the complete run of LASFAPA and *De Profundis*, and the first 150 distributions of APA-L. Karl Lembke had sent his scans of all the APA-Ls to the Eaton Collection of Science Fiction & Fantasy at UC-Riverside, so that has been saved. Row kept a copy, too.

We still have cabinets for the Westercon archives. Oink Oink Flap Flap, the locked, fireproof file cabinet was retained. ("The LASFS will need a locked filing cabinet when pigs fly," said Bruce Pelz.) The paid movers did an incredible job of moving heavy objects, especially with the library books. More fit LASFS helpers would be helpful next time; Claypool and Dean Johnson were able, but exhausted. It took us less than two and a half hours, including yammering. It was very satisfying to see it sorted. We also found a couch, which was "released back into the wild," i.e. thrown away.

Eylat Poliner: Regarding Karl Lembke scanning APA-L, he was doing that up until his last month at home before going into the hospital. He was dedicated to the LASFS until the day he died.

Powell: In terms of other storage, we're done with Loscon 49 and getting ready for Gallifrey One. He took note of the hotel change for Loscon 50.

AV Equipment (Dean Johnson): At the storage unit, we eliminated some of the AV equipment like the VCR, assorted mixers, a very old video projector, and overhead projector, and other things. We kept the main AV from the club house such as power strips, a power amp, and the video switching system. We also kept a slide projector because we still have slides, but not in the carousels. We are paying for the volume of the pallets, so leaving a few small things won't cost us any extra. We kept the DVD and Blu-ray players. A couple of items are going to auction in a couple of weeks. Recent donations of books will go to the Los Angeles Vintage Paperback Collectors Show.

Events (Eylat Poliner): No report

Loscon 50 (Eylat Poliner): The Loscon Web site is live with the flier art. Programming suggestions and contact links are also live. The harassment and weapons policy pages are live, but the "mental health" page is to be announced.

There will be a slideshow of previous Loscon people and events. The art show, dealers room, and tech are intentionally left blank because we need to do the walk through on Feb. 4 after the Gallifrey One meeting. We would like to keep it small for the first walk through. Another walk through is possible March 30 for the department heads. Crys Bowie's mother is in the hospital, but Poliner and Bowie have talked about the hotel. There's a Zoom volunteer meeting scheduled for Jan. 21 at 4 p.m.

Poliner and Julia Ree will be meeting with Stefan and Spider Robinson on Feb. 21. They are doing cross-promotion. We have sold about 20 memberships since the convention. There wil be an advertisement in the Gallifrey One program book. Poliner will meet with Genny Dazzo and Laura Brodian Freas Baraha to discuss their needs, and with Laura for badge art.

Proposal: Poliner would like to volunteer to chair the next two Loscons, to encourage continuity. Christian B. McGuire expressed that he tried that several years ago, and it did not work. Two Loscons in a row is a lot of work. Someone else can be talked into it, but not him. Heide Nichols said that it's Michelle Pincus's fault; she made it look easy by practically running the last two Loscons. Pincus suggested the board table this topic until next month. Start poking people.

Publications (Christian B. McGuire): McGuire spoke to Heath Row, who is still comfortable doing what he is doing, maintaining bits of the LASFS, communicating with Eaton for preservation, and publishing *De Profundis*.

Marketing and Recruitment (Michelle Pincus): We are tabling at Gallifrey One (Susan Fox, maybe Matthew B. Tepper for one day) and at Strategicon (Krystal Rains), as well as the Los Angeles Vintage Paperback Collectors Show on March 17.

Significant Others

Club President (Cathy Johnson): We're still meeting via Zoom, but there is a live meeting

coming up Jan. 25. It will be a live, hybrid meeting. There will also be a Big Auction. Buy stuff to benefit the club and take it home. The location was found by Nick Smith: New Musicals Inc., 5628 Vineland Ave. in North Hollywood.

Eylat Poliner is continuing as club events coordinator. She will have some personally busy times but will book speakers and events before that. Elayne Pelz has checked other churches and banks for meeting space, with no luck.

Webmistress (Kristine Cherry): Not present

Agenda Items

Heide Nichols drew attention to the LASFS By-Laws Article III: Directors, Section 1: Number and Qualifications. Susan Fox indicated that Nichols lives in one of the specified counties; that is not relevant. We should not allow a By-Laws change.

Cathy Johnson: It used to read Los Angeles County or able to attend meetings. Nichols asked if the board could suspend that By-Law until we change it legally. Christian B. McGuire remarked that we should elect someone who is qualified and then examine the By-Law at our leisure. Rob Powell asked whether there is any precedent for this situation.

Johnson cited in chat: The Board, by a majority vote of the directors who meet all of the required qualifications to be a director, may declare vacant the office of any Director who fails or ceases to meet any of the above qualifications that was in effect at the beginning of that director's current term of office.

> Article III. Section 1. Part C C. When elected, and continuously while serving, each Director shall meet the following gualifications: 1. Be an Attending Member, and have maintained such Attending Membership for at least 156 regular Society meetings; 2. Be an Attending Member continuously during the previous 52 regular Society meetings, unless prevented from doing so by a medical condition or by being temporarily absent from the area; 3. Reside within Los Angeles County, Kern County, Orange County, Riverside County, San Bernardino County, or Ventura County; 4. Not have been declared of unsound mind by a final order of court; and 5. Meet such additional activity requirements as the Board may establish pertaining to activities of the Board itself. The Board, by a majority vote of the directors

> who meet all of the required qualifications to be a director, may declare vacant the office

of any Director who fails or ceases to meet any of the above qualifications that was in effect at the beginning of that director's current term of office.

Matthew B. Tepper: The board has at various times ignored its own rules about this section. For example, Michael Thorsen was retained on the board despite lack of access to a computer that could do Zoom.

Johnson suggested that we keep Michelle Pincus on the board and recommended that she not be nominated for chairman. Then the board can discuss that By-Law with the club membership. The world has changed, and the By-Laws need to change with it.

Pincus agreed to attend in person if the board starts meeting in person again. Eylat Poliner commented that the By-Laws need to include Zoom attendance. She agrees with Nichols about retaining Pincus as a board member for all her other work that nobody sees. Poliner also agrees about the need to discuss participation by people outside the area. We do need to protect ourselves from ahostile takeover.

Nichols asked whether someone can make a motion to keep Pincus on the board until a change in By-Laws or the end of her term? McGuire suggested the board elect someone else as chairman today. Johnson indicated we need 15 members or a motion by the board to present a By-Laws change to the club. Gavin Claypool, Tepper, and Poliner have been assigned to work on a By-Laws revision.

New Business

Board officer election: Heide Nichols, Christian B. McGuire, Gavin Claypool, and Eylat Poliner nominated Matthew B. Tepper for chairman. He will run, but not against Michelle Pincus.

Vote: Tepper abstained and won the election. He took over the meeting.

Nominations for vice chairman: Poliner nominated Heide Nichols, who was elected.

Nominations for secretary: Poliner and Gavin Claypool nominated Susan Fox, who was elected.

Nominations for comptroller: Michelle Pincus and Heide Nichols nominated Gavin Claypool, who was elected.

The rest of the appointed positions:

- Library (Gavin Claypool): Retained
- Quartermaster: Heide Nichols cannot serve in this role as vice chairman. But we should not need the snacks and soda sales until we have a permanent

meeting location. Susan Fox volunteered and was approved.

- Archives (Cathy Johnson): Retained
- Physical Plant/Storage (Rob Powell): Retained
- AV Equipment (Dean Johnson): Retained
- Events (Eylat Poliner): Retained
- Publications (Christian B. McGuire): Retained, with great help from Heath Row
- Marketing and Recruitment (Michelle Pincus): Retained

Open Forum

Eylat Poliner: On the topic of AI artwork at Loscon, sales of AI-generated art have been banned at other conventions. Will we allow or ban its sale in the Art Show?

Christian B. McGuire remarked that that is a decision for the Loscon chair, not the board, and we should support that decision. Rob Powell commented that we might have a precedent about digital vs. non-digital art. It's about the tools.

Cathy Johnson recommended that someone speak with the art show director as the expert on the artists and works. We don't want to present stolen AI art, and the art show people should weigh in. Art show director Elizabeth is a good source and already judges what goes into the art show for sale.

Michelle Pincus pointed out the difference between original digital art produced by the artist, and Al-generated pictures. Dean Johnson commented that it is difficult to distinguish digital art from Al-generated art, but people who are caught are generally turned in. Stating that we do not approve of Al-generated art based on other work is a fine statement to make, but proving it will be difficult. Look at the artist's history. If they pop up suddenly with monkeys smoking cigars, that's a warning sign.

Christian B. McGuire said that 99.9 percent of art in Hollywood is painted by people on tablets. We must be very clear about differentiating original art with digital tools from Al-generated pictures. Heide Nichols knows someone was selling Al-generated art at the last Loscon. She regards it as a form of plagiarism. Maybe require a signed statement by digital artists to affirm their original work?

In chat, Gavin Claypool also proposed requiring full disclosure by artists of the use of Al. Pincus offered that John Hertz has a colleague who can probably advise on digital art issues. Rob Powell said it will come down to a discussion between the art show head and the convention head. This is nothing new; it comes down to people.

Johnson remarked that it's not just the tool. Nobody creates anything new with this particular tool—not just visual art but music and other art forms. Matthew B. Tepper suggested that the board seemed to be in agreement. People in Al-generated artwork can be distinguished the same way that aliens were identified in *The Invaders*: The hands are wrong!

Take-Aways

The AI art issue for Loscon will be considered by Eylat Poliner.

Work on the By-Laws about residence requirements will be worked on by Poliner and Gavin Claypool.

Next Meeting Date

Feb. 11, 2024, at 11 a.m.

Rob Powell won't be able to make the next meeting. He will be traveling on personal business.

Eylat Poliner will be shopping for Gallifrey One, which is the following weekend.
