Board of Directors--the Board has recommended the following changes to the standing rules: 1) that Advance Dues and VAMFs be kept in the main Treasury rather than the Building Fund, and that the Treasury be responsible for ordinary maintenance expenses (e.g. utilities, supplies). The Building Fund would be reserved for major repairs/improvements, taxes, and eventual purchase of another larger building. 2) doing away with the Projector Fund as a separate entity, transferring the few dollars currently in it to the main Treasury, and making projector upkeep a Treasury expense. These <u>don't</u> require By-Laws and will be voted on at the April 17th meeting.

The Board also formulated the following rules about movies shown as part of a LASFS Open House: When there are two showings, the earlier will be open to Members and guests, while the later will be restricted to Members only.
