Andy Rosen advertised ditto fluid for \$2/gallon, cheap; and seeks volunteers for a Super 8 film (nudge nudge wink wink). Alderson announced a Roger Hill slide show as the program for 2401. Bob Null reports that the Bookaneer, Vanowen St and Tampa Ave, offers a discount for LASFS members. Rick Foss is trying to get a group together to fly to Coppercon at discount.

Tom Collins says there is a new print in town of the greatest movie ever made--which, in case you don't know, is THE CHILDREN OF PARADISE. Tom also pitched a Lovecraft apa, the Esoteric Order of Dagon. Bruce brought advertising about interactive laser discs on sale for \$50 each instead of \$320 each. the six discs of interest are (titled?) VOYAGER, APOLLO, SHUTTLE, THE SPACE AGE, ASTRONOMY, and GEOSCIENCE. Bruce suggested the club buy the discs even though we have no way to play them (and we're not likely to get a player).

Pelz spoke for Alderson's revised method, which is similar to the one in current use except that only first-place votes are counted in each iteration, with the option of reballoting after each seat is decided. Sharpe pushed a simple plurality approach : each voter picks 3 or 4 names, and all votes counted once (just like the are mundanes do it). Deckert proposed treating Board elections as a sequence of single-office elections.

Andy Rosen asked Dan Alderson, "are all of these methods mathematically correct?" Alderson replied, "They all have the property of not electing more than the available number of offices, if that's what you mean." (applause.) DASher informed Rosen of the proof that no election algorism can avoid all of a certain set of paradoxes.
