THESE MAGAZINES FIRST SAW THE LIGHT OF DAY AS SEPARATE MAGAZINES, SFS COMING OUT IN MARCH OF '39 AND FF IN NOVEMBER OF THE SAME YEAR. THE TWO MAGAZINES WERE MERGED IN APRIL, 1943 AND DISCON-TINUED ALTOGETHER IN JULY OF THE SAME YEAR. THE LAST MAGAZINE CAME OUT AS VOL. 3 - NO. 5 BUT THE NEW ONE IS NUMBERED AS VOL. 1 - NO. 1. FOR THE FIRST ISSUE THEY HAVE SUCH AUTHORS AS GEORGE O. SMITH, MURRAY LEINSTER AND LESTER DELRAY THE MAG HAS A BERGY COVER AND THE PRICE IS A MERE 150 PER COPY ...


