
locs, which should take care of the rest.

GOOD THINGS, ODDMENTS, ETC.: Since he was kind enough to list me as a co-founder despite the fact that I had to bow out for lack of time, I should mention that Nick Polak has started a music apa, entitled APA-LP, and that I got the first mailing and it is quite good. Remarkably good considering that it only has five members so far ... but with luck, and a well-maintained Spec list, it should succeed. The orientation is rather eclectic, but, unlike previous attempts at much the same thing, there seems to be a modicum of intelligence and thought in the various members' comments. A lot of Serious Discussion from quite a variety of viewpoints. Recommended, no matter what your musical interests. OE is Nick Polak, PO Box 1453, Middletown, NY 10940; minac is 4pp every 2 mailings; mailings are monthly with deadlines every 15th; and dues are \$2/yr with a copycount of 35.

I haven't bought many records this year— as a matter of fact, the sum total of my attempts to keep up on that front recently has been pathetic—but one LP that I think I can wholeheartedly recommend is Mike Oldfield's OMMADAWN, a two-sided, long, varorium composition composed by the same English prodigy who did TUBULAR BELLS,


the sleeper that became a hit when someone from THE EXORCIST decided to use a bit of it as theme music. Since BELLS, Oldfield seemed to be doing nothing spectacular— an orchestral arrangement of BELLS was recorded by the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, with Oldfield on guitar, and he put out a rather quiet and mildly classical—sounding peice called HERGEST RIDGE, but now that OFMADAWN is out, it

seems to put all that in perspective, and, indeed, serves as an effective fusion of the spectacularly mutable nature of TUBULAR BELLS and the restrained, taught construction of HERGEST RIDGE.

Oldfield is a phenomenon of sorts, and his music is unique. His peices are modern and technological, not in a phony-artsy sense of being noisy concaphonations of biz-

sounds and pretentious electronic gadgetry, but rather in that they are of a form that would truly have been impossible without present-day recording technology, yet progress naturally from a number of valid musical traditions, including classical



symphonic music, baroque variation works, Spanish guitar, English folk music, and much of the work of the "progressive" rock groups— Genesis, Pink Floyd, Jethro Tull, et al. With Oldfield himself playing the majority of the disparate instruments he employs (bazoukis, glockenspiels, banjos, the standard rock electric-and-percussion instruments, and a variety of others, both familiar and esoteric), selecting other instrumentalists for such things as Northumbrian bagpipes, and generally engineering and producing the entire affair with a meticulous and subtle grasp of how to produce just the right sounds, the result can really only be described aptly by the terms of another reviewer— as "achingly majestic."

Emphatically recommended.

More Good Stuff... Another "specialty" apa being started, this time one I'm in, is Bill Patterson's APARIA (pronounced ah-puh-REE-uh, a pun on the Greek term aporia— look it up, look it up!), an apa devoted to rigourous and semi-rigourous discussions of various matters philosophical, metaphysical, and cosmological. Copycount 25, no minac at the moment, and the first deadline is July 15. Umm, I note that that deadline is likely to have long-since passed by the time anyone reads this... so the second deadline is August 26. (Schedule, I beleive, is to be roughly six-weekly.) OE: Bill Patterson, 1700 S. College #23, Tempe AZ 85281. I haven't seen the first mailing at the time of this typing, but as far as off-the-cuff comments are concerned, I think I can safely say that it's likely to be worth joining if you have any interest in the Sensawonder-related subjects at all, if only to get Bill Patterson's zines. And I know that there are other people, all high-quality, who have expressed some interest in getting in...

Quickly: One of the best things recently for the ever-fluctuating state of the Art of Fanwriting has been the revival by Arnie Katz of SWOON, a plump, friendly, fannish genzine that seems to be succesfully holding to a strenuous monthly schedule. With material by Harry Warner, Terry Carr, incredible on-stencil art and written stuff by Ross Chamberlain, competent editorials by the Katzes, etc., SWOON isn't likely to be exactly begging for success, so get it. The Usual or 6/\$5 from Arnie & Joyce Katz, 59 Livingston St #6B, Brooklyn, NY 11201. Note—SWOON seems to one of a vanishing breed— the all-twiltone fanzine, warm and comfortable, so watch out for that high mercury content. ### For all you incipient technocrats out there, Jon Singer's GESTETNER OWNERS' BULLETIN just might be useful. Singer seems to be the, ah, ringleader in a vicious cabal concentrated in the New York area devoted to raising the standards of fannish mimeography by such outre experiments as the use of acrylic based inks (an experiment that didn't work out— there are Some Things Fan Was Not Meant To Know!), and so forth. He,

however, barely redeems himself by producing this rather handy bit of esoterica. There is no real organization -- it reads more like a collection of working notes than anything else, with various observations on cleaning out ink guns, devising impromptu setups for feed mechanisms, etc. Jon also seems willing to print any information on Selectrics and other hardware people send him as well. Available for expression of interest (though a stamp would probably be appreciated) from Jon Singer, 167 Vine St Middletown CT 06457. 4// Fandom has analysed itself and contemplated its own navel with varying degrees of success in the past, and FAN-HISTORICA may well turn out to one of the more successful examples. The first issue, dedicated to Lee Hoffman, contains a reprint of an article by her, a section of various articles on numerical fandoms -- including the famous Silverberg peice- both original and reprinted, various other reprinted peices, some exceptional on-stencil art, and a column by Gary Farber which is one of the freshest and funniest things I've read in a fanzine in Quite Some Time. Stu Shiffman contributes some illustrations of an SF/Fandom Foundation/Museum, giving the zine its official New York imprimatur and feel, one of which is hand-colouredon all copies! -- by Karina Girdansky. An exceptional fanzine, informatively scholastic yet lacking in the heavy-handedness that seems to infost many a zine that sets out to be Purposefully TruFaaanish. The Usual or 50¢ (75¢ for #2) from JoeD Siclari, PO Box 1343 Radio City Sta New York NY 10019. (Note to Bruce Coulson and the rest of 2nd-generation fandom: JoeD and Karina Girdansky are getting married in October, and since Karina is a 2nd-generation fan herself... here comes the 3rd generation, and All Fandom Trembles In Expectation ...)
