THE FIFTH YEAR

There were 47 members on the rolls when the last mailing of FAPA's fourth year went out, but 51 were members as of the first mailing of the fifth year. FAPA has been at or near its membership ceiling from that day to the present.

The "Turn the Rascals Out" pitch on the election was not successful. Or, at least, those making the pitch did not succeed in getting elected. Officers elected for the year were:

President - Warner
Veep - Rothman

Sec-Treas. - Perdue
OE - Chauvenet

FAPA has been an essentially stable organization from this year forward. There were significant questions at about the time of the 30th mailing, but my collection is so incomplete at that time that I cannot properly report on it. The incidents since have been relatively minor in retrospect, even though they might have seemed major at the time.

The items that I particularly note with this fifth year are the increasing importance of Californians in FAPA, the significance of the Michigan contingent (first appearance of A Tale of the Evans, En Garde), the continuing decline in importance of New York fandom (Futurian branch), and continued interest in science fiction as a field of literature.

The voices that influenced FAPA in its first six years came mostly from its founding members or people who joined shortly after formation: Wollheim; Michel; Lowndes; Rothman; Speer. Development of mailing "style" came to some extent from these (primarily Rothman and Speer) but also from such later members as Stanley, Ashley, Tucker, Widner (a personal favorite of mine but probably not of historical import), and Chauvenet. With the Twenty-fourth mailing there appeared on the FAPA scene its greatest shaping force since the first mailing, and what is probably still FAPA's most famous fanzine--Francis Towner Laney and Fan-Dango.

Rosenblum's name above reminded me that this was in WWII days, and it had been a while since I'd seen the name of a non-USA publisher in FAPA. Rosenblum was almost the only non-US publisher available to US fans in WWII.

THE SEVENTH YEAR

Again, the primary source of information for mailing contents is Shaw's THE FAPA INDEX, slightly supplemented by comments made by Coslet when he was working on an updated index (completed through about mailing 50 but never published) and on occasion minor other sources. The list of officers comes from Ellik's BAREAN 7--Ron thoughtfully and characteristically sent me an extra copy of that vital page in early 1961. When I use such scattered sources I have to remind myself that stealing from one is plagiarism, but stealing from many is research.

THE EIGHTH YEAR.

Troubles with the Futurians had been minor in the recent past, and they had regained sufficient acceptance to be elected to FAPA office--or at least the office of president. Shaw was closely allied with the Futurians, Schwartz was evidently considered as, at least, not unfriendly. Elected were:

Veep - Ashley

Sec-Treas - Schwartz
OE - Shaw

On January 30, 1945, Shaw resigned. Lowndes appointed Watson to finish out his term. On January 31, Lowndes resigned. His term was completed by Ashley. Since the reason for these resignations (from office, not from membership) center around the 30th mailing, discussions of the reasons will be found in the introductory comments to that mailing.

THE THIRTIETH MAILING--NOVEMBER-MARCH 1944-1945. WHICH INCLUDES
SECTION A ("THE BASTARD MAILING") DATED NOVEMBER MAILED
DECEMBER 1944 AND SECTION B, DATED JANUARY 1945. DISTRIBUTED
IN FEBRUARY AND MARCH 1945.

The trouble started when a Futurian-sponsored amendment to change the mailing date from December to January passed. For some strange reason, despite the amendment, Larry Shaw put out in December a mailing dated November. There were immediate complaints--Laney wanted his magazine in the 30th mailing and not this strange unauthorized December mailing; other members had not completed their fanzines since they'd been working toward the January mailing date.

During January, it became known that a new APA was forming--the Vanguard Amateur Press Association, or VAPA. Lowndes was an officer in the new group. Mike Fern in January or so published Neither Blind Nor Idiot, which evidently carried much of the news of the new group but also some charges that a plot was underway to eliminate FAPA. Later reports indicate there was no such plot, and the people behind VAPA merely wanted an organization more to their own tastes than FAPA.

Lowndes' stated reason for resigning was to avoid conflict of interests, and his main interest lay in the new group. Shaw's stated reason was the furor over the December mailing. Shaw got out both halves of the 30th mailing, even though he had resigned before section B was distributed. In fact, he had quite a time with it due to illness and unemployment amongst the New York group, and a temporary inability to find the secretary-treasurer and equally important, the funds to get out the mailing.

EEEvans heard of the fund difficulty (probably through Ashley) and advanced the funds to get the mailing out from NFFF money. (We're talking about \$10.00--times were hard.) The funds from Evans solved most of the problem, and Shaw got the mailing out a few bundles at a time on his way to work. Some copies, of course, were handed out to NYC residents much earlier, and Rothman had carried a number of bundles to Boskone.

The designation of the two sections of the mailing as 30A and 30B stems from a decision of VP Ashley as implemented by Shaw. I am providing only a combined listing, with "A" or "B" designating the two sections of the mailing. "P" as usual means postmailing. Precipitant 2 was postmailed after section B, Neither Blind nor Idiot I'm guessing was postmailed (it's not in the FA listing of the contents of section B) at about the time section B went out.
