THE THIRTEENTH YEAR

The uncontested election went about as one would expect, with each of the candidates elected to office:

President - Boggs Sec-Treas - Warner Veep - Spelman OE - Coslet

In the two prior years Burbee and Laney had carried through on their promise to get the mailing out on time. Coslet carried through on this during his years as OE, with the mailings as regular as clockwork.

There were wome worries this year about the size of the treasury, and the dues increase amendment which went out with the 47th mailing failed to pass since less than one-half of all FADA members voted. Other concerns of the year included the small size of the mailings, the limited number of people on the waiting list, and some feeling that Coslet carried the interpretation of the "identical copies" rule beyond what the constitution intended.

THE FOURTEENTH YEAR

Laney and Spelman both filed for the office of President and Boggs and Rotsler for the Vice Presidential post. The other offices were not opposed. Results were the election of the following officers for the year:

This was, in a quiet little way, a transition year. The treasury was in adequate shape, the officers were competent, the mailings remained on the light side (quantitatively and qualitatively speaking) but they did come out on time, and some interesting people came into FAPA. The transition was brought about through and because of the newcomers--people like GMCarr and McCain and Danner and Hoffman and Elsberry and the Coles coming in change an organization.

Not much improvement in size. 182 pages. But from this mailing forward for five or more years there is a substantial increase in both quantity and quality. Danner's high quality work and questioning mind had to play a part. The substitution of Irusaben for Spaceship was favorable (yes, Bob, some of us remember). The bubling enthusiasm of Lee Hoffman (her first FAPA material shows up next mailing) contributed. G M Carr (who also first appears next mailing) introduced a weird and new type of contention into FAPA. Washington State fandom presented its own wacky humor--and sometimes some pretty good material along with it. I probably should have traced Washington State people entering FAPA as I did for Washington DC; the longterm impact was not as great, but impact on mailing content at the time was fairly similar.

FAPA BOOK is not a history. It's a collection and collation of facts--about the mailings, about the members, and about the magazines, and only a small part has seen print to date. I've kept some historical notes running partially to please certain readers, but also because the data by itself is just too dry. In general my notes are for background rather than to feed my conclusions to the reader.

Some years ago a fan created numbered fandoms. Seventh fandom was the result, and that is a result that I would not want to see repeated. We in FAPA can call ourselves members of fandom's oldest group if we want, for it's true. Yet FAPA today resembles FAPA₁₉₃₇ in only a slight way. I've no convinced opinion on how many FAPAs there have been. The first twelve or so mailings tend to fall into a group. Emphasis here is on structure, control, and purpose, with strong emphasis on the political, both internally within FAPA (control) and internationally (purpose). Mailings thirteen-forty-eight seem to fall into a second group, with a split at mailing 30 into two sub-groups. To me it seems that the mailings were going in the same general direction over this time span, but the VAPA creation at maibing thirty had a noticeable affect on the balance of the mailings and of the executive direction of FAPA. Laney entered FAPA with the 24th Mailing (first appearance of Fan Dango), and there is no question that the FAPA center of gravity started swinging west at that point, with the switch fully confirmed in about mailing 33, when the Ashleys moved to Los Angeles. Mailings after 48 fall into another group, which doesn't last up to the present but does last long enough that I don't want to bring it in to the discussion at this point. Mailings 49-54 are the primary transition mailings between FAPA, and FAPA, And the contents of mailing 55 may not look all that much different from the table of contents for mailing 54. The mailings are still in transition, but the decline of the old is now fully evident, and the new decidedly takes over.

Of interest for the sake of continuity, the Irusaben in this mailing was the last to include Diskin as co-editor with Silverberg. Also, with the next issue, Orgasm changed its title to The Big O due to the continuing puritan prudery of the times. The Coles bowed under pressure. They never said so, but I was one of the ones who objected to the title Orgasm. Looking back from 1975 at the me of 1951, I'm not too surprised that my prudery showed, but I am somewhat surprised that I knew what the word orgasm meant. Or, maybe that was my trouble, maybe I didn't. (For whatever it's worth, the Coles, Jacobs, and I were quite close at the time. Les & Es were in the San Francisco area, I was in Maryland but knew them thru LeeJ and corresponded with themand LeeJ was in Paris but had spent much time in the DC area prior to his shipment overseas.)

Since I used the abbreviation LeeJ above, let me clarify that LeeJ was Jacobs, LeeH was Hoffman. I also find that I've used Laney throughout this work without specifying whether I meant Alvin A or Francis T Laney. In all cases, unless otherwise specified, I'm referring to Francis Towner Laney.

THE FIFTEENTH YEAR

The ballot for the year reflected the following candidates for office:

President - Bradley, Rapp Vice President - Eney, Pavlat Secretary-Treasurer - Riddle Official Editor - Boggs, Evans

Boggs, Riddle, and Pavlat won their respective races for OE, ST, and Veep. The race for president was a dead heat, with each candidate receiving 22 votes. Laney attempted to resolve the dilema (in the postmailed The Fantasy Armature to the 56th mailing) by ruling that "Arthur H. Rapp and Marion Z. Bradley are alternating co-holders of the presidency of FAPA." There might be some question as to legality of the ruling, since Laney was no longer president since the election was over--but then no successor had been elected, so maybe he was. Laney gave Rapp the presidency for the first and third mailings of the fifteenth year, and Bradley the presidency for the second and fourth mailings. The final provision of Laney's ruling was that "In the event that either of our presidents should refuse to serve under these terms, the vice-president, Bob Pavlat, will succeed to the portion of the presidency thereby vacated."

Marion declined to serve under the Laney conditions. In the FA for mailing 57 I exceeded my power as veep (tho not my power as alternating co-holder of the presidency) by amending so much of Laney's ruling that read "...the vice-president..will succeed to the portion of the presidency thereby vacated" to read "...the remaining co-holder of the presidency will succeed to the portion of the presidency thereby vacated."

Thus, despite some initial confusion, it is possible to give a clear list of officers for the year, namely:

President - Rapp Sec-Treas - Riddle Veep - Pavlat OE - Boggs

One last point on the fourteenth year. Coslet was the first OE to serve two full years in succession.

I might as well make one other personal observation on the first fourteen years of FAPA. At the present time (1975) I have six filing shelf segments devoted to FAPA mailings. The first fourteen years occupy one segment, leaving five to go in this index.

Dropped from the roster after the 57th mailing were Ballard, Cole, Pesetsky, and Spelman. Added were Winne, Terry Carr, Lawrence R Campbell, and Delcie Austin.

FAPA Poll results are interesting, At least 30 votes were received. Among the top ten were new members Hoffman, Danner, Willis, Tucker, and the Coles, with G M Carr (#12) and McCain (#17) not too far behind. More proof of the transition.

The FA contained the "Report of the Fapa-Saps Merger Committee." Nothing ever came of it.

Briggs, Felkel, and Loan dropped from membership. Since Derry had dropped the year before the quantity of DC fans was reduced to essentially where it is today except for White, still some three years in the future, and other yet later additions. Other drops included Black, Blish, Weber, Stein, Crane, and Ryan. Additions were Tom Covington, Richard Bergeron, Roscoe Wright, Jimmy Taurasi, Dave Ish, Ken Slater, Gregg Calkins (at last, one that's still with us), Bill Venable, and (retroactive to this mailing, announced in the next FA) Fred Robinson.

THE SIXTEENTH YEAR

Candidates for office were: President, Hoffman, Jacobs; Vice President, Beale, Eney, Silverberg; Secretary-treasurer, Winne; Official Editor, Boggs. Winne was drafted as a candidate without his prior knowledge since nobody had filed for the office, but he cooperated as did teller Rick Sneary, who also had not been asked to serve. Elected to office were:

President - Hoffman Sec-Treas - Winne Veep - Silverberg OE - Boggs

And so Boggs became the second two-year OE.
1952-53 was to be a good year, with membership turnover
starting to stabilize at four people in/out per quarter, with
good quality in the mailings, and with 1574 total pages for
the year compared with 1468 for the prior year and with 1471
for 1947-48. But here is how Boggs compiled the figures,

We aren't quite up to the big mailings period yet, but they are coming. There's a plateau here. The steady four-members in/out per mailing will hold for yet another six mailings. Mailing size will bounce around a bit, but in a healthy way. Five and six people per quarter will start entering the waiting list to fill those four vacancies that are appearing every quarter. As it's happening it looks like the waiting list is getting healthy, for a waiting list which might not provide members to replace turnover is discouraging to a member. But as the queue grows, as the wait extends, you find that too long a list has as many problems as too short a list. By this time, 1953, FAPA is a completely solid institution, still feeling a bit of pressure to keep membership full, but respected and reliable. Mailings came out when they should. Money was available as required. We'd survived VAPA and SAPS, and while we suffered in quantitative comparisons with SAPS we held our own with either group qualitatively. (Held our own? I m usually not that prone to understatement. Neither VAPA nor SAPS ever seriously challenged FAPA's quality.) VAPA tried hard, and died of pretentions. SAPS never tried. They were in for fun. They succeeded admirably.
