

## FARPSINVEY ATO

First of all, I guess I'd better tell you that $I$ had a very good response from SAPS ( $83 \%$ ) and a very poor one from FAPA ( $40 \%$ ). My FAPA statistics, however, are a bit more representative than they might have been, because I had SAPS polls from a few bi-apans bringing the sampling up to a rousing $44 \%$. But on the whole the Fapasurvey probably didn't give a very clear picture, because not only is it a small relative sampling, but many members didn't answer all questions. But here is the picture, as clear as I could get it for you. (Maybe the fact that there were two other polls distributed in FAPA last mailing accounts in part for the poor response.)

Reading down the menbership lists in THE FANTASY AMATEUR and THE SPRCTATOR discloses that the membership of each apa is $19 \%$ female and $81 \%$ male. The average FiPA male is 31 years old; the average FAPA female 24 years 2 months old. (Except, I don't tunk this is a very good statistic on the women's ages at all; you see, no woman over 27 filled in tinis question on the Fapasurvey.)

The average SAPS male is 26 years 10 months old; the average female SAP is 32. (If one lady's age were discounted and the total re-divided, the average age would be $27 \frac{1}{2}$ for SAPS femmes.)
The average height for FAPA men is 5 feet ll inches. For swering my poll was in FAPA, and there were three or four men in SAPS 6 feet 4 inches. But of course there are quite a few teen-aged fellows in SAPS; this probably explains the younger average age of the SAPS men and the slightly shorter average height.)

Both the average FAPA gal and the average SAFS gal are 5 feet 5 inches tall. (Why should they lie?)

The average male FrPan vieighs 177 pounds; the average female FAPAn supposedly weighs ll6. (This latter is another statistic you may feel free to ignore, due to lack of answers in too many cases.) The average male SAP weighs 166 pounds and the average female admits to 120 .

The average member of both clubs reads science-fiction fairly regularly, though the percentage is quite a bit higher in FAPA. (FAPA, $84 \%$; SAPS, $67 \%$.) It might be interesting to note here that it's mainly the youngest group in both clubs that doesn't read stf. Some lost interest as their tastes matured; some are forced away from reading for pleasure by other activities--school, social, etcet.

There were other reasons given too, for not reading stf, but they mainly boiled down to loss of interest. (See graph at end of report.) of course, all those who don't read stf at present, used to. Books and nasazines are about tied for favour.

The average FAPhn belongs to 80 of a local fanclub, while the figure for satis is . 70.

FAPAns have been to more cons than SAPS members have, but they've also been in fandom quite awhile longer. FAPA: 2.91 worldcons each, and 5 regional cons each. SAPS: 1.98 worldcons each, and 2.69 regionals. The average $\mathrm{F}_{\mathrm{r}} \mathrm{Pan}$ has been in fandom li years, $1 \frac{1}{2}$ months, attending an average of .66 cons per year. The average Sre has been in fandom 7 years 11 months, with .60 cons per year.

The average FrPAn has .63 spouse, whereas the average SAP has only .50 spouse. The FAFAn has 70 child ( 1.1 per married member); the SAP has .56 child ( 1.13 per married member). These spouse-andchild statistics, by the way, represent an almost $100 \%$ sampling of each apa-I went down the rosters and filled in for those that I could, which was most.
"MIr. Average FAPAmeraber" has 1.47 duplicators, to "Mr. Average SAPS member"'s 1.41. There are $1.7 \%$ typers in the possession of the average FAPAn; the average SAP has l.48.

The average FAP goes to 1.78 movies per month. (Hi, Bob.) The average SAP goes to 1.5 per month. (Note here that taking out the number of movies attended by Bob Tucker--who is a movie projection-ist--the average hovie attendance by Fainns is . 84 times per month.)

The average member of each apa consider himaclip an actifan outside the group; $83 \%$ in FADA and $97 \%$ in SAPS. The average FAPAn pubs . 64 of a genzine and the average SAP pubs 1. The average FAPAn is in l7\% other apas; the average Sip is in . 60 others. of these biapans in FAPd, 6 prefer FiPd, 4 prefer SiPS, one prefers OIPA, and 4 were undecided or declined to state. In Sips, 7 of the biapans prefer S.PS, 3 prefer PAPA, one prefers OMPA, and 5 decline to state. In both apas, those who preferred Fhpis said it was because Fhph has higher quality material in general and those who preferred SAPS liked that clup's friendiness and cohesiveness. Those who preferred OMPA didn't say why.
