THE CAMPBELL BOOK PUBLISHED: "John W. Campbell: An Australian Tribute" is published by Ronald E. Graham and John

Bangsund; designed, edited and printed by John Bangsund, PO Box 357, Kingston, ACT 2604, distributed by Space Age Books, 317 Swanston Street, Melbourne, Victoria 3000 for \$2 a copy/100 pp.

This here beautifully duplicated (roneo) book has finally arrived and puts to an end the vast body of "Campbell Book" jokes which have been floating around. Now that it is available it will be read and appreciated by everybody who is interested in Campbell, what he did and his place in the history of science fiction. There are twelve tributes by various Australians, articles by George Turner and John Bangsund, papers delivered at a Melbourne Symposium on Campbell from George Turner, John Foyster, Redd Boggs, Henry Couchman and Wynne Whiteford as well as a couple of letters from Campbell to various people and a bibliography by Donald H. Tuck. The forward is by Jack Williamson and the Introduction is by John Bangsund.

Write off to Space Age this minute for information about this Book, it is probably well worth your time.

It is hoped that this as yet untitled book, which will be a "prestige paperback", will contain works by Australian, US and UK writers, most of whom will be able to attend the convention. Lee Harding will be the editor of this anthology and his work will have to be finished by August this year in time for a June publication next year. The anthology will receive a Commonwealth wide circulation.

As mentioned in an earlier issue, Wren will also be publishing Bert Chandler's "The Bitter Pill". The latest word on this is that the publication will be in hardcover, that it will be promoted as a mainstream novel and that it too will receive a Commonwealth wide circulation. (LH)


FAN GROUP DISCOVERED: Very little is known yet of a group of SF enthusiasts reported to exist at the University at
