Following a night spent in a motel in Vallejo (a pec-culiar sort of a dump just outside of SanFran) I placed a call to Bob Stewart and



San Fran has been elected as the 1954 Con site. This was decided at the recent Philom on which we have no report.


However, as San Fran was also elected as the site on the 1954 Westercon site, bothe Cons will be held simultaneousty in a huge 4 day sprce.
