That night there was a close out auction in which Moscowitz, Ellison, and myself auctioned off a goodly amount of originals and manuscripts. That night was mostly spent in saying goodbye to those who were leaving.

Tuesday I bid goodbye to Robert Bloch who was leaving with a few broads clinging to each of his three arms. Man, what sex-appeal that Bloch has! Then went with Rothman and Madle to the bank where we counted the Convention money. We only lost a hundred bucks si Said so-long to Madle, who was leaving for N.
