President's Report

FAPA is still spinning quietly in its orbit. There have been no alarums nor excursions this quarter, at least none that have made disturbing echoes audible from here. I am rapidly coming to the conclusion that this business of being Prexy of FAPA is a snap. Of course, because I have said it, the very skies may fall throughout the balance of the year. I sincerely hope not. It is fun being the President, but I should hate a really nasty fuss.

There is one little matter which I want to take up which I consider to be of real importance for the best interests of FAPA, and so indirectly to all of us. Some of you I am sure will disagree. I am asking you to humor me in this. I am aware that a few of you are opposed to the Egoboo Poll, and a number of you are simply indifferent to it. Some of us, on the other hand, not only like it but feel that as a very old tradition in FAPA it should be preserved and perpetuated. It is, after all, a method whereby we may, for very little time and trouble, distribute some welcome egoboo to our more deserving members. Don't you think those who have made a special effort and have presented fanzines or artwork or articles or mailing reviews etc. that were more than usually enjoyable deserve a little extra commendation? Do you think Harry Warner or Jack Speer or Bill Rotsler are utterly indifferent to finding themselves at the top of a category, or high up in FAPA's Top Ten? Maybe they are, but I doubt it like hell. If so they are a different breed from most of us. I know I am not indifferent to such. Most of us I am sure try to put out something a little superior to the general run, not only for our personal satisfaction, but also for the enjoyment of others in the group, and we are gratified at recognition. If we were totally indifferent to our fellow FAPAns I doubt that many of us would go to the bother of remaining members.

Of course the Egoboo Poll is in no way as important as a regular FAPA general election, but if we become careless and fail to vote in the Egoboo Poll it is not very surprising that we so frequently have a poor showing in the regular election. We have several times been treated to the shocking spectacle of an amendment which fails at election time, not because of lack of support -- it may have got all the votes -- but because less than a fourth of the membership took sufficient interest in their own APA government to vote. Tragically, this same apathy is displayed in elections in local and national governments in mundania. It has been said by some Wiseacre that people get the kind of government they **deserve**. In a larger sense this is a truism. Unfortunately, the minority who do take an interest and vote have to endure the poor government along with those who caused and thus deserve it. All this may seem far afield indeed from the Egoboo Poll, but the fact remains that if we grow lazy and careless in voting in this, we may well grow lazy and careless in voting in the important elections as well.

So now you have the message, let's get behind the Egoboo Poll and vote for those we think should have a bit of applause. Distribute your largess generously and gather in that which will await you when the results are published. So don't put off till too late... vote. Look up last year's four mailings -- it won't take too long, you won't have to re-read much unless your memory is unusually faulty. If you are too rushed or lazy to do that, depend on memory or just vote on the last eligible mailing. That is sloppy and inequitable, but better than not participating. Fill out your ballot, mail it on time.....VOTE!

THE VICE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The 1966 Egoboo Poll is distributed with this Mailing.

The Egoboo Poll has solicited little response from the Membership in recent years. Several members have suggested that the poll be dropped due to lack of interest; however, most of the Members who attended the FAPA Tricon Meeting favored poll retention.

As noted in last Mailing's VP Message, Tricon FAPA concensus was that a certain number of ballots should be received before the poll results should be tabulated and published. This idea was also favorably received by a number of Fapans who were not at the Tricon. Accordingly, the 1966 Egoboo Poll form specifies that a minimum of 40 ballots must be received to insure poll tabulation and publication.

Forty ballots are not really too many. More than 70 Fapans (including Instant Members) are eligible to vote; consequently ballots are required from only slightly more than half the membership. Remember, more than 50 members voted in the last election.

The 1966 Egoboo Poll retains the three classifications of the '65 SNEARY poll, but reverts to a more classic method of point awards. Total publication effort has been assigned the maximum point value. Please vote for people, not fanzine titles. It may be questionable to consider LEEH's SF Five Yearly as much of a regular publication as HARRY WARNER's Horizons (altho SFFY has yet to miss a deadline); one could argue that "regular" and "one shot" might apply to certain zines. Use your own judgement; the teller will be lenient. EDITOR/PUBLISHER applies primarily to layout and reproduction.

Writing and art awards fall into a second classification. Purists might complain about MC's being relegated to the same status as other types of writing, but MC's are less prevalent in FAPA than in the other apa's, and are therefore so treated.

General point awards fall into a third classification! The MOST WEIRD & PERVERTY category does not necessarily apply only to Canadian fans. In recent years the expression has become a catchphrase for "unusual" or "off-beat" which, according to the SPEER hypothesis, applies to all of Fandom. Points in this area could be awarded to SAM MOSKOWITZ for reading, science fiction, to BOB SILVERBERG and BOB TUCKER for writing science fiction, to TERRY CARR for editing science fiction, or to RON ELIK for having nothing to do with science fiction.

The usual 5 points is automatically the property of those who send in a ballot. Keep them yourself, or give them to someone else.
