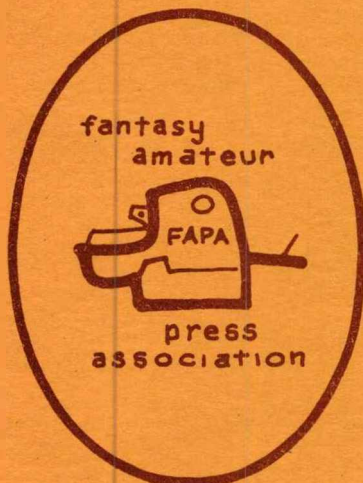

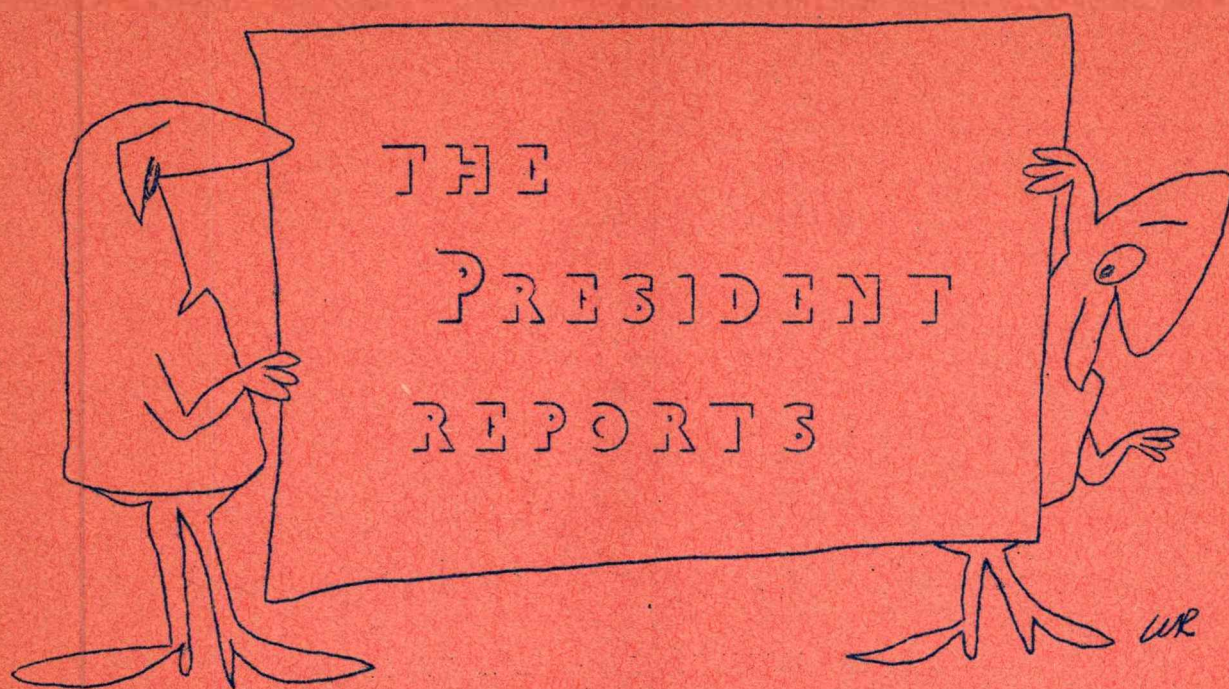

DEADLINE FOR NEXT MAILING

FEBRUARY 13, 1971



Everybody knows that FAPA is decaying. It's conventional wisdom nowadays. Last mailing Andy Porter reported how Terry Carr, Ted White, rich brown and Steve Stiles immediately throw out a big chunk of each mailing when they get it. I know a number of other FAPAns who do the same. Nobody even seems to remember what was in the mailings; when it comes up (infrequently) in conversations, you get blank looks. So it's not too surprising that people have been dropping out at a high rate. We lost Tucker last year, a real blow. Take out an FA from two years back and look at all the waitlisters who were later admitted to membership and are already gone. Now check that two-year-old membership list against the one in this FA. It's educational.

There isn't much an officer can do about this. The quality of FAPA is in the hands of its members. I think the trouble is that fandom itself has suffered a general decline in interest in the craft of writing, and so we don't see many formal pieces in FAPA any more. Those full-scale articles and humorous essays were part of the lifeblood, and except for Warner and Boggs and a few others, nobody writes them any more. Mailing comments? They're still around, but the advent of Xerox and fast mimeography has given birth to the biweekly and monthly APA. Norm Clarke predicted in 1965 that these APAs would bleed FAPA dry, and he was right. The ability of frequent APAs to give quick response has cut into the traditional role of FAPA mailing comments. And those frequent APAs show no signs of going away.

I think the best thing FAPA can do is concentrate anew on the quality of the material produced. No more quickie minac, if you can at all avoid it. If we all concentrated on writing some really good material, stuff that has a point and is aware of the nuances of the English language, I think we'd all benefit more than we may even suspect. Mailing comments needn't vanish, but they can be little miniature articles in their own right, with something to say. And you--you, sitting there and reading this, yes, you--might feel a little better about your minac-ing. Eight pages of good writing is quite a lot in one year.

I believe FAPA still holds the best goddam writers in fandom, and it could hold more. They're waiting outside, on the waiting list. There has been a ream of talk about the possibility of voting waitlisters in over the heads of others, but little has been done about it. A constitutional amendment is proposed for your consideration a little further on, which hopefully will do the job a little better than the Special Rules a number of FAPAns and I had previously had under study.

We were considering submitting a series of Special Rules which would provide that some waitlisters, named individually, would be admitted to FAPA as soon as a vacancy exists. We feel that FAPA is a private club and as such can admit anybody it likes, in whatever order it likes. Some waitlisters might be offended at this, but to keep this to a minimum we would have gone through the wait list and selected the fans who had been the most active recently and who promised the most during FAPA membership. The aim would be to pluck them while they're ripe; in three years they may well be as old and tired as the rest of us.

But the primary aim of the Special Rules would have been simply to sound out the membership. You may not think selecting some waitlisters over others is moral and seemly. Fine. If you agreed with the idea in theory, you could have looked at the individuals we named and seen if you wanted any of the people in FAPA. The voting on the rules, we felt, would provide us with some hard data on the feeling of the membership; until now we've seen only scattered mailing comments and perhaps a desultory show of hands at some Worldcon FAPA meetings.

After some consideration, we decided that the constitutional amendment was a somewhat better route to take at this time.


PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE FAPA CONSTITUTION

9.3 The Vice-President shall distribute, with the annual egoboo poll, and as a part thereof, an official form on which the members may list names of waiting-listers whom they would like to see given preferential admission to FAPA. Any member of the waiting-list receiving 20 or more votes in this section shall be advanced to the top of the waiting-list. If more than one waiting-lister receives 20 or more votes, the top three vote-getters will be advanced and ranked in order of the votes they received. No more than three waiting-listers may be so advanced in any year. The Vice-President informs the Secretary-Treasurer of the results of this portion of the poll and tabulates only those having more than 20 votes as part of the egoboo poll. Advancement to the top of the list will occur with the following quarterly mailing after current vacancies have been filled.

The egoboo poll already has constitutional provision for objecting to waiting-listers and I personally don't see why it can't just as easily have one for showing unusual approval. Whatever the sentiments of the membership may be, I hope we will all vote. A special election is called for next mailing to cover this proposed amendment according to Section 8.1 of the constitution.

We're dropping the dues, too. I know that the current 'recession' is a personal hardship for some FAPAns; there's no reason FAPA should be more of a financial strain than it has to be. When the treasury goes back down, dues will rise again. Meanwhile, enjoy!

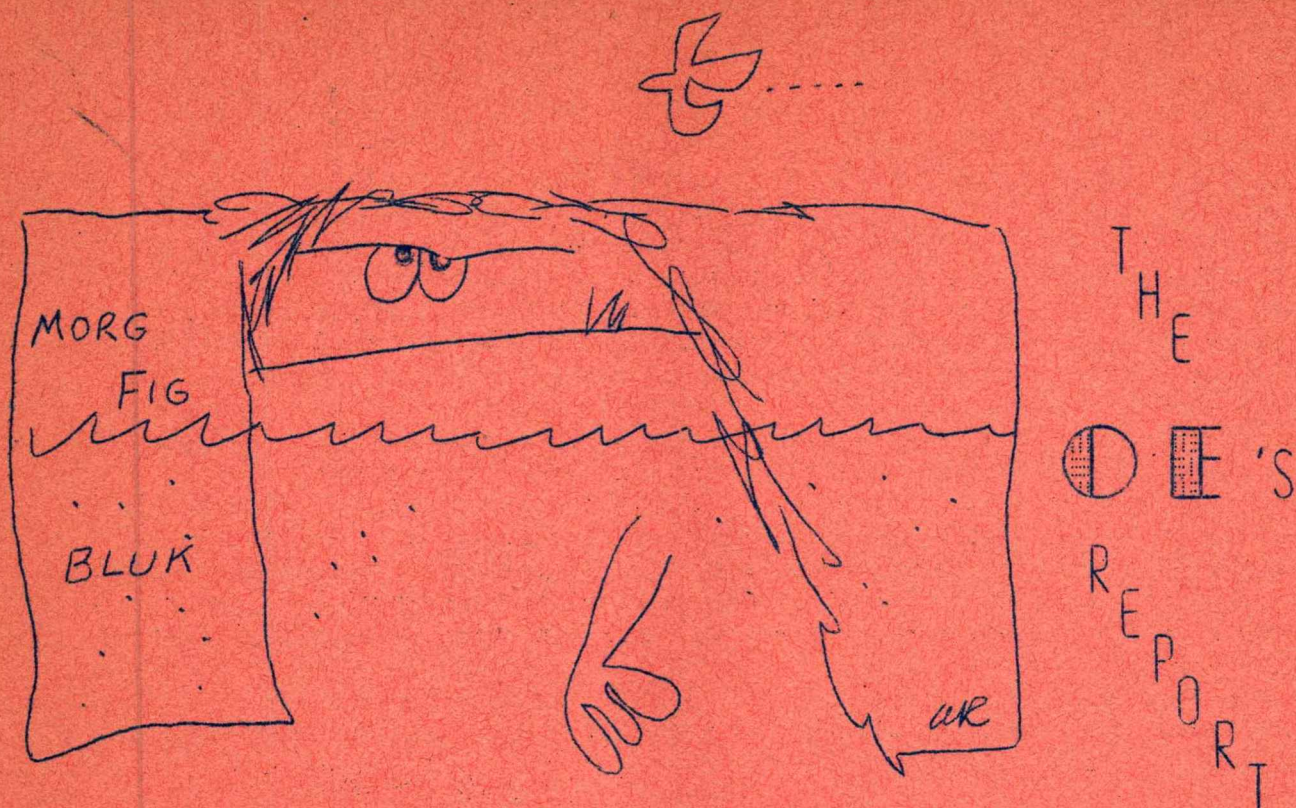
Mail Service:

Well, here we are, down to the short strokes. It is Sunday afternoon, November 15, and all the bundles are assembled on the living room floor waiting for these last stencils to be run off. It's been an experience, I'll say that.

I hope you like the cover format--you'll be seeing it the rest of the year, so you might as well. I had it run off at work on Standard Oil's multilith and since I had to sort of fob it through I had them run off enough for all four quarters at the same time. This opportunity might not present itself again, so I decided to make the most of it.

The illo down in the lower left-hand corner is a slight break from tradition. I have never liked the so-called FAPA seal, even though Eney used it back in 1958, but I wanted some sort of filler illo which would sort of represent FAPA on the front cover. I asked both WRotsler and Bergeron if they would care to try their hand at something, but both declined...Bergeron on the grounds that Bill was the ideal choice for the task (he didn't know I had contacted Bill at the same time) and WRotsler said that the room involved was too small for his style. I'd still like to see something from Bill for this spot, though--if you send it in the near future, Bill, I can always manage to have it reduced to an appropriate size on the company Xerox, so feel free to draw it at whatever size suits you best. If I run for reelection, and I suppose I will--but who knows what next November will bring? --I'll work it into the cover for the next year's bundles. Or pass it on to my successor for consideration.

The Bakersfield Post Office has as yet not fully declared itself on the FAPA mailings. I went down last month to try and head them off at the pass and was referred to their "customer relations man" no less! After a long discussion he allowed as how he didn't feel the FAPA bundle would qualify for 'book rate' but that he would approve of it being mailed as 'educational materials' (a classification, he wryly pointed out, which included Johnny Cash records among other things and I had to agree that FAPA certainly stood as good a chance of being educational as that). Since this carries the same postage rate, things appear to be settled. Nonetheless, my rubber stamps say both 'book rate' and 'educational materials' just to be on the safe side.

There will be an amendment coming up as a special election next mailing, and inasmuch as it could represent quite a change in FAPA membership in the future I can't stress too much the importance of registering your vote. The question of whether or not--and how--to admit apparently more desirable waiting-listers in a preferential manner has long been debated in FAPA with, as Greg notes, little in the way of concrete action. Since the egoboo poll has constitutional provision in Section 9.2 for the elimination of undesirable waiting-listers it seems only logical to me that there is ample room in implied precedent for promotion of the more desirable waiting-listers. Naturally, if this were allowed to get out of hand it could make a shambles of the waiting-list, but I think the restrictions contained in the amendment (the promoted waiting-listers must receive at least 20 votes, and no more than 3 w-l'ers can be so advanced in any one year) are ample to protect the average waiting-listers. At any rate, the decision is up to FAPA, and ultimately that means your vote.

Regarding the mailing: a number of your bundles arrived here in rather poor condition, although everything was intact. Let me remind you once again the PO is not the most tender of mistresses. Also, I'd like to express my appreciation for those of you who sent, as a previous OE once called it, a baker's 68 copies. The thick FAPAazines are easy to count, but how many of you send thick FAPAazines? A number of people sent 70 copies and I appreciated the margin for error on both of our parts. What could be sadder than a FAPAazine with too few copies for the mailing?

Your comments on the FA will be appreciated.
