




### The descent from the pillar

12 January 1947

To the Officers and Mombers of the FAPA. ...

Gentlefon:

Member E. Everett Evans has submitted to me a copy of his publication, ATOTE, dated Fall 1946, containing the following marked paragraph:

"I am sonding an advance copy of this regazine with this article marked, to the Vice President of FAPA, asking him for a ruling on whether op not the Official Editor is allowed to accept or reject magizines PURELY ON HIS OWN PERSONAL LIKES OR DISLIKES, for this seems to no like far greater 'dictatorship' than anything yet attempted in fandom."

Before I make the requested ruling it were well to point out that the judicial powers of the Vice President do not extend beyond the interpreting of the FAPA constitution. Extraconstitutional rulings are the prerogative of the President. See the Vice-Presidential ruling rendered by Bob Tucker and published in The Fantasy Frateur, Vol. 9 No. 2.

My decision on the question raised by Brother Evans is this:

Article 9(d) of the FAR constitution clearly states the various duties of the Official Editor, among which is to mail with the official organ \*copies of publications of which members shall have provided him sufficient capies to cover the entire membership." Article 10 sets up certain requirements for FAM publications. It follows from these articles that it is not the duty of the Official Editor to mail publications lacking sufficient copies or not conforming to Article 10, and that accordingly he may exclude such items from the mailings. He is not authorized by the constitution to exclude publications for any reasons other than those mentioned in the above two articles.

Article 9(a), however, accords the Prosident "all the necessary powers to deal with such situations not otherwise covered by the Constitution." This plainly permits him to order excluded from the mailings any publication where reasonable doubt exists as to the legality of depositing it in the mails, or where the nature of the publication is such as to render the mailer liable to criminal prosecution for any other reason. It cannot be construed as a license for the Prosident to use his powers unnecessarily or capriciously, and hence he cannot accept or reject magazines on the grounds which Evens has challenged, nor can his agent. Article 9(a) also empowers the President to delegate to an agent his legitimate power to exclude

publications. This is the basis of the "consorship" power which has been entrusted to the Official Editor. In exercising it he is not acting under his mandate as Official Editor; he is acting as the appointed agent of the President. Hence it is up to President Rothman to specify how he wishes to handle the consorship detail.

First Indorsoment:

The fact that the thing has already gene through the mails doesn't mean that it is legal. It simply means that they weren't caught. Such an item is justifiably emitted from the mailing. (I thought it was a swell drawing, incidentally.)

I was not certain whether the Timebindor cover in question was the same as those in previous mailings, or whother Evans had made a new one. Since it new appears that the same old drawing is the cause of all this fuss and furer, I must say, with deepest regret, that my old tevarisch Elmer Perdue is full of unmentionables. We need not even consider whether Elmer is correct in his interpretation that the two gentlemen in the drawing are homesexuals.
