Dropped: Fred Smith (dues-activity) and Bill Rickhardt (see below). Joined: James V. Taurasi Sr (credentials: editor, Science-Fiction Times). George Charters has not had time to reply, which is why we have only 64 members this time.

- 2. The matter of William Rickhardt. Rickhardt was #1 on the waiting-list until Bloch resigned, creating a vacancy. Bloch's resignation took effect to include the 90th mailing, and all postmailings—that is, Bloch was a member until the Saturday of the 91st mlg, in May. Therefore Rickhardt could not become a member until May (per sec 2.1 of the constitution) and his entrance credential, "Flip" #1, was over a year old. So I have been forced to declare myself in error in admitting him, and have accordingly refunded his dues.
- 3. This matter of legitimate sex. Nobody has taken advantage of the Shacktivity Credits ruling I made as vice-president over a year ago, but lots of people have gotten married. This quarter we welcome Mrs. John Trimble to the Saragasso Sea of fandom, and this quarter your president, Bill Evans, has made a ruling to help solve problems for future sec-treasurers. As of now, all persons entering FAPA through marriage are assigned provisional positions on the waiting-list (or provisionally retained in their old positions) in case of divorce. Applicants to FAPA membership must acknowledge every other issue of the FA, but I'm going strongly to urge my successor to up this to every issue.

The President's Message

There are two items of business this time. First, the annual election of the purkers officers who will be responsible for the smooth functioning of the organization for the next year. At this time I don't know who they will be; the report will come from another of you joint-membership members, Bob and Juanita Coulson, who are hereby appointed tellers.

Item two is the amendments. After the three printed in the last mailing appeared, Bob Pavlat sent in a combination of the first two that appears reasonalbe. So, I've exercised my authority and have combined them. So, there will be only two amendments to be voted on this time.

- 1. Amend Section 2.3 of the FAPA constitution to read:
 - 2.3. An individual who wishes to join FAPA shall send to the Secretary-treasurer an application stating his desire to join, and citing credentials as described under section 212 of this constitution. The credentials must have been published not more than one year prior to the date of application. The secretary-treasurer shall dotorrinc whether the credentials are valid; if so, if there is a vacancy, ho shall 'admit the person to FAPA membership upon payment of dues. If there is no vacancy, and the credentials are valid, the applicant shall be admitted to a waiting list as of the date his application is received by the secretary-treasurer; the waitinglist shall be maintained by the secretary-treasurer and shall be published in the official organ each quarter. Copies of the official organ shall be sent each quarter to each person on the waiting list. The secretary-treasurer shall require from each person on the waiting list suitable confirmation of continued interest in membership not less often than every other mailing; non receipt of such indication shall be grounds for removal from the waiting list. As vacancies in the membership occur, the secretary-treasurer shall motify the individual who applied earliest, at which time the person shall again cite valid credentials, published whithin a year from the date his membership is to begin, and must pay dues. In all cases, membership begins upon the date set for the next quarterly mailing, unless a different date is set by the secretary-treasurer.

- 2. Amend Section 3.3 of the FAPA constitution to read:
 - 3.3. On ordersment by 22 other members, a member's lack of renewal credentials shall be waived on a particular occasion.
