THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

First of all, following the illustrious examples of several past presidents of this illustrious organization, I ought to thank the members who voted for me. After all, by the time a few months have gone by, I may be in more of a mood to thank those members who didn't vote for me! So consider yourself thanked, each and every one of you.

The first piece of Official Business before me is to call a special election for the February mailing on the following proposed amendment to the FAPA constitution;

"To amend FAPA constitution as follows; raise blackball amendment from 10 to 22 objectors.

'Section 9, Special Rules;

9:2. The vice president shall distribute with the annual egoboo poll, and as a part thereof, an official form on which the members may list names of waiting-listers to whom they object. The vice president informs the secretary treasurer of the results of this part of the poll and does not tabulate it as a part of the egoboo poll. Any waiting-lister objected to by 22 or more of the voters in this poll is dropped from the waiting-list and may not apply again for admission for one year.

If adopted this resolution shall be effective with the current egoboo poll, "

Also properly before me this time, but in a somewhat happier vein, is a proposal from one-half of our secretary-treasurer, Bjo Trimble. Since, however, the President is the Official

Voice of FAPA, or something, Bjo dropped it into my lap; where I present it gladly, with a bit of regret that it wasn't my own idea.

In brief, it has been suggested that FAPA, as the <u>Fantasy</u> Amateur Press Association, could and should logically assume the privilege of presenting the annual award for Fantasy Art at the Fan Art Show which is beginning to have so much importance at each Worldcon,

Previously, this award has been presented by a private individual; but it seems to me that the award would have more meaning if an old and respected organization such as FAPA stood behind the award. We might also look at this point; except for holding a yearly meeting at the Worldcon, FAPA does nothing FOR fandom, except for the rather dubious distinction of being called "a somewhat snobbish elite". Maybe we are the elite of fandom -- judging from the waiting-list, I'd say we are. Well, noblesse oblige, you know.

In case you think this would be a heavy burden upon the FAPA treasury, Bjo told me to be sure and point out to you that a trophy, such as has been awarded in the past, would cost a maximum of fifteen dollars. That's about a quarter for every member of FAPA, even when we include the correspondence necessary to appoint a professional judge for the giving of the award, and for approving the design,

I think, personally, that FAPA might equally well consider the possibility of giving a cash award in lieu of, or in addition to, such a trophy.

I have one further suggestion to make; in fact, by the Extraordinary Powers vested in me, I'll make it a Roval --hem--Presidential Edict. Bjo Trimble, Juanita Coulson and Elinor Busby, all of whom have had something to do with the Fan Art Show previously, are hereby appointed a Committee of Three to draw up a report which will Tell FAPA All about this projected award; what it might be, what it would cost, how it would be awarded. You might also take note of whatever comments are made in the February Mailing, and present a report to us no later than the May mailing, so that matters may get in train for presenting such an award, if we choose to do so, in Chicago. If you want to present the report in February, and answer the objections and comments in May, that's all right too.

As ex-official editor, I have only one question to make of the membership; should we consider adding "acknowledgement of fanzines received" to the O-Ed's duties? And, remembering the heavy cost of the extra FANTASY AMATEURS sent to the waiting list, might we not consider charging the waiting-list a registration fee--maybe to be applied against dues?
