(Supplement to the February mailing) Dave Van unjam has asked me to do something about his membership, on the grounds that $7 \frac{1}{2}$ months confinement in a Mexican prison is a situation not covered by the F.PA constitution. He tells me that he expected release soon enough to contribute to the February mailing, and now expects release by mid-February. He also reports asking two FA Pis members to circulate a petition, without pinpointing the exact type of petition.

I think the circumstances justify my proclaiming a one-mailing period of grace for Dave. He emphasizes that he wants to contribute regularly to Finis and that he will. have access to publishing equipment as soon as he can return to the United States. So, unless petitions have already been completed in time to make my decision redundint, I approve extending until the May 13 mailing date the deadline for Dave to provide activity credits and to pay his dues.
+++ Report for May
If you were FAPA president, what would you do with a member who admitted that the CI a had financed the publication which he had used to complete activity credits, but appealed to me to retain his membership because two other F Pi members don't exist and are actually hoax-fans?

I didn ${ }^{\circ} t$ rule on that situation because it was the one mess that did not turn up to bedevil me during the past three months. Everything else you could possibly imagine happened. Maybe the other officers will describe some of them in their messages. I don't have the heart to relive the exciting events that ranged from the question of whether being in jail is a situation not covered by the Fils is cornstitution (I decided it was) to another member ${ }^{\circ}$ s query whether he should send 68 copies of the fat farzine that would arrive from his publisher four days before the deadline via airmail to Gregg, when he doesn't need the activity credit (mercy, no, I said, my parsimonious nature shrinking from the very thought).

And as the sun sinks slowly on my term as official president, I would prefer to make one formal and official request to this organization. Please, will somebody rewrite the constitution, or hire an attorney, or contact the Eternal Verities, or otherwise solve one potential ciganizationwrecking ambiguity in the constitution? The president deals "with situations not otherwise covered by this constitution" and there"s nothing in the constitution advising how anyone can sort out situations covered from those that oren ${ }^{\circ} t$. Fisk Sneary and Ithink alike about most things, and the ambigutty caused no trouble during this past year. But sooner or later, a future pres. ident will be at odds with his vice-president, the president will consider an issue not covered by the constitution, the vice-president will consider it an issue invalving the meaning of the constitution, and they will issue contradictory rulings and which ruling does the organization observe?








THE VICE-PRESIDENT ${ }^{\circ}$ S
MESSLiGE TO FAPA
The peacefull months in office when there was
nothing to do and nothing to worry about ended with this last quarter. Three members, Carl Brandon Jr, Don Miller and Dare Van Amam, memberships were Dead On irrival, as of the last mailing, and thoy all appealed. Dave's was the more unusual case, and he petitioned under irticle 3.3 as well as appealing to president Warner. I believe Harry will report on this, but as Dave got the needed 22 signatures there is no problem.

Brandon and Miller were granted a one mailing oxtension by executive ruling, because of Postal foul-ups and dom lays, and udministration confusion, not helped by flights of letters that crossed in the mail. They are expected to have their make-up zines in this mailing, or there will be more confusion.

The Egomboo Poll had a slightly better responce this year, for which I am grateful ...though the freelent reminders of FhPA friends that they hadn ${ }^{\circ} t$ voted yet, help. cd. I haven't looked it up, but I believe 18 ballots may be the best return in years. But due to the wide spread in the voting it looks even bigger. And it required the fanac of three days to tabulate and prepare. of course the fact that I counted the non-cass points, and then totaled the lot to make sure all the points were accounted for, $r$ gs good bookkeeping practice, but a lot more work. The rem sults are fairly interesting, if only to show how quickly we forget. Not one vote fon the Coulsons, though they were still members during part of the year covered, and thus more eligible for notice than several of the non-members who did receive points. But, at least no active member who has published a first issue suffered the fate of zero points.

I did have my mind changed over one thing, regarding the poll. Earily on, I rem ceived ballots frcm both Earl and Jan Evers. I checked the constitution and read Article 2.5 "Husband and wife, each having acceptable credentials, may establish and maintain a joint membership, which shall be regarded as a single person for payment of dues, roceipt of mailing, voting in elections, signing petitions, and in holding office.

In view of this I wrote that I would except only one ballot from them, and unless othorise informed, I'd take Earl's as the one to count. They didn't protest, but when I mentioned this to Evans and Warner, they did. inlso ox-officer Ed Cox took me off in a corner and tried to explain it all to me. How husband and wife teams put in equal amounts if work to retain the joint status, and each have a right to cast bellots in tho poll. is this does seem to be the precedent, I reversed myself and did count both Earl and Jan's ballots. (The Moffatts, who had cast a single ballot, aftor reportedly argueing all night as to who had the right to vote for which, and for what, and for whom-on hearing this, doubled their vote.)

I did it, but I can ${ }^{0} t$ say I liked it. I can ${ }^{\circ} t$ see anything in the constitution that I can interpret as meaning this. To me the idea of joint membership is like that of a business partnership, in which eather member is responcible for all the oblogations of the partnership. The way it is, seems to confer an unfair advantage in the balloting (though not enough vote to make any difference in reality). While it doesn't apply to the Evers or Moffatts, why should a joint membership who are getting by with min-ac, have the right to vote twice, when Narner, with 96 pages a year, votes only once? Or, what of married members who maintain two full memberships, like the Breens, yet issue joint fanzines? They have twice the expense,
with no extry right on the Poll. Should they take out two joint memberships, and thus have the right to four Egomboo Poll ballots? The constitution doesn't say : they can't, any more than it says that joint membershps can. Do you think it fair?

Two other items... two members sent in ballots a woek after deadines (from different States). This only shows that not all fans are Slans, and that some members have as much trouble reading figures as I have spelling words.

Lastly, I do not plan to follow the FiPi tradition in which the Vice Prosident runs for President next year. So, someone else of you better file. I expect to be plenty busy this summer with four local Cons...so, you all come, you heayp

I assume all of those people had initial credentials-monly the S-T could say for sure. Note that Marion Bradloy and Waltor Breon, although marriod, have elected to maintain separato memborships, both producing renewal crodentials, paying dues, otc.

The egoboo poll, on the other hand, is a sort of somi-official document, mentioned in Section 6.12 but otherwise unspecified. Voting in the poll is not a requirement for memborship. (If it were, a lot of lazy bums would bo out on their butts \&) The purpose of the poll is public recognition of the efforts of the more prolific and talented mombers of FIPI by the rest of the membership. is I see it, the more votors the better and I seo no reason why otherwise active members who are sharing ono membership to conservo spaco should not each cast a ballot if they dosire to do so. This is all unofficial, of course, since I am only the OE, but to me it all sooms very reasonable.

The S-T has boen very busy and did not montion it, but ballots will bo includod in the fugust mailing. If you want your name to appear on the ballot you must file with the $S-T$ in writing. I've docided to take another fling at being OE againm-I must have something wrong with my head-and hope the assombly session schodulod for this weokend justifies my decision. But let's havensome candidates, how about it?


Sneary's gripe about the double ballots in the egoboo poll bears a little discussion at this point. With the 83rd mailing and effective upril 15, 1958s the FiPM constitution was revised with respect to memberships. In particular, Section 2.5 was created, which says: "Husband and wife may jointly share a single membership, and will be considered as a single person under the requirements of this constitution " In the 87 th mailing, then President Bob Pavlat further ruled: ${ }^{4 \prime}$ porson on the waiting list who marries a FiAM member and thereafter sharos a joint momborship may, when legal action is instituted to dissolvo the marriago, reclaim the position he formerly hold on the waiting list with respect to persons who were on it at the time he became a joint member. If this position has sinco advancod to within the membership the individual shall be admitted to Fiap, as a full membor upon payment of dues. Renewal credentials as required of a new member will be required. The original member shall retain sole rights to the former joint-membership position."

In the 98th mailing, Vice President Bill Evans said: "I almost forgot. This yoar, married (joint) memberships get two copies ((of the egoboo poll ballot)) to avoid fights." This was an independent decision on his part, presumably under the auspices of Section 6.4, and thus began the double ballots.

In the 104 th mailing several amendments were proposed. One said: "mond Soction 2.5 by adding: "fusbend and wife, each having acceptable credontials, may ostablish and maintain a joint membership, which shall be regardod as a singlo person for payment of dues, receipt of mailings, voting in elections, signing petitions, and holding office. ${ }^{0} \pi$ This amendment passed. Nother proposed amendment read: "Bef re a dual mombership is eligible for renewal as a dual membership, the Socrotary $=$ Froasurer shall ascertain that both partners have contributed equally." This amendment apparently did not pass--it does not appear in the constitution, and S-T Bill Evans made no mention of it either yea or nay.

There may have beon some other rulings and/or discussions, but I can ${ }^{\circ} t$ remomber them at the moment. So, what does this all mean? My interpretation is that in ordor to sort of stretch the 65 member limit just a trifle, married members were allowed to adopt the corporato fiction of a single ontity. I always considered, mysolf, that in ordor to maintain the jointness of the momborship, oach party was required to maintain renewal credentials. The first Section 2.5 said \%...considored as a single porson under the requirements of this constitution but the rovised Section 2.5 doos not. The amondment to requiro equal participation did not pass, so apparently the general F.P. sentiment is to not require more than 8 pages botween them to maintain renewal credentials for both members. Initial membership credentials are requirod for joint membership, but the spouse is not required to apply for a position on the waiting list. (continuod on bottom of provious page)
