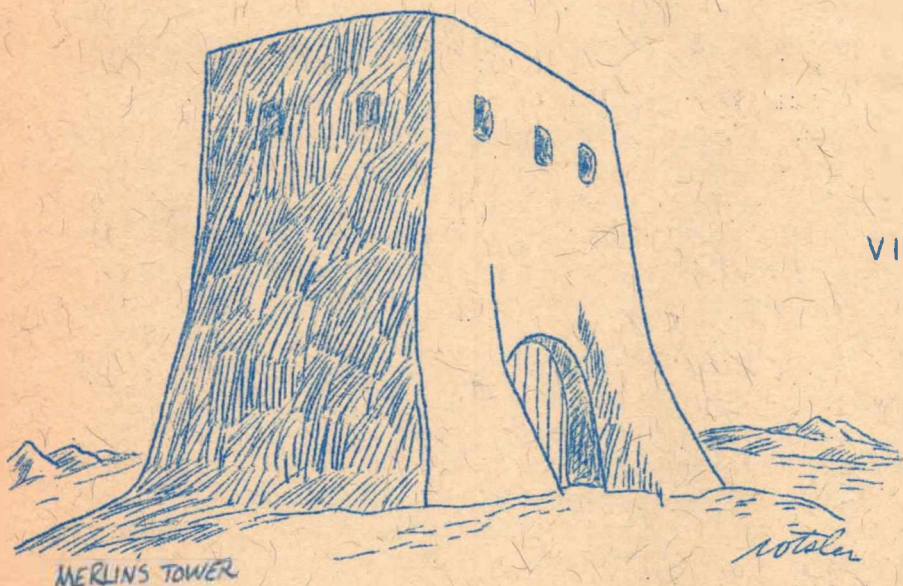

VICE - PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

No FLP business has come my way these past three months. So I can use this space for some remarks about the egoboo poll. Nineteen ballots were returned. If you scent foul play because only eighteen first place votes are shown in the major categories, you should seek more subtle tabulation shenanigans. One member used the poll sheet only for the sake of Section 9.2. I think this is better response than in most years, and I suspect my simpler voting system helped.

I might explain a few decisions that were involved in tabulations. I intended at first to disregard votes for stuff in the February 1973 mailing. Then two persons voted for ALIEN CRITIC at a time when I thought Geis might top everyone in the grand totals. I counted those votes, so I wouldn't perhaps give myself victory by such a ruling. I counted other stuff not in the 1972 mailings, to be consistent. Then I realized something else. If two members voted for a fanzine title that did

not appear until 1973, how could I know if various members voted for me or for someone else as best writer or best commenter because of what they'd just read in the February 1973 mailing?

I think FAPA should consider seriously a change in the egoboo poll timing for this reason. If it went out in the November mailing, there would be no danger of anachronistic votes. It would also be filled out three months closer to the first bundle of the year under consideration. In the February 1972 bundle were good, big issues of zEEN, ALTJIR, and MIRAGE. They and their publishers got little attention in this latest poll. They might have been better remembered if one fewer mailing had intervened. If it seems unwise to force a vice-president to draw up a poll form so soon after his election, the outgoing veep could prepare it and the next one could tabulate it.

Whoever is vice-president next year might consider some further simplifications of the poll. Unless fiction and poetry become more plentiful, those categories seem useless. Note that this time only 26 valid points were awarded for poetry, out of 114 available points. I also wonder about the validity of the unsung FAPA category. It's a sort of reverse egoboo and several members used it this time to plug the cause of favorite sons who were obviously destined to be well sung for accomplishments.

But I was promising to explain several decisions. I didn't count a few votes which I diagnosed as cheap shots. They were for three members, none of whom would have topped any category with their aid, and they involved only nine points altogether. Anyone who wants to emerge from behind the anonymity of the ballot and complain about my spoiling his joke should do so. I did count some votes that seemed the result of honest mistakes or dubious value judgments like the poetic quality of someone's prose.

When more than one editor is identified with a FAPazine that received votes in the magazine categories, I gave the full point total to each of its editors. This did not alter any of the highest places in the grand totals. Where I've listed votes for a couple, it's because the couple were listed that way in one place by a ballot. One member clearly wrote Devon as recipient of some points. I couldn't find any evidence of material by a writer with that name in 1972 and decided it was a slip of the pen for DeVore.

I may get some criticism for giving five points to each member who voted. Three points has been the custom in recent years, and the categories produced lower totals this year because fewer points were available. But this has been a sore spot with me for quite a while: the way any member can help his standing in the poll by failing to vote. In such a small organization, he is quite apt to finish higher if he doesn't scatter points among his rivals. I think my change is partial rectification, but ideally those point rewards for voting should go in the individual categories rather than only in the grand totals. I would suggest awarding two points for voting to the member who votes in each category where he receives any votes at all. Here again I wouldn't have made the change if it had decided first place in the grand totals.

The figures in parentheses after the totals in each category represent first place votes. I planned to total the first place votes and show them in the grand totals, but desisted when I decided that one more half-hour of tabulating would drive me into permanent and complete gaffiation. You can figure it out for yourself, and you'll find if you do that I've behaved in this poll exactly as I did in the 1972 Hugo race, getting fewer firsts than other people and sneaking in ahead because of more garbage points. I like fandom but I hate tabulating FAPA egoboo polls. They don't treat me like this in the NFFF.

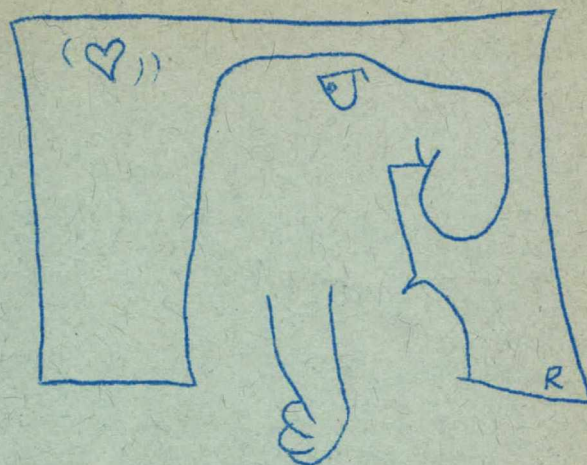

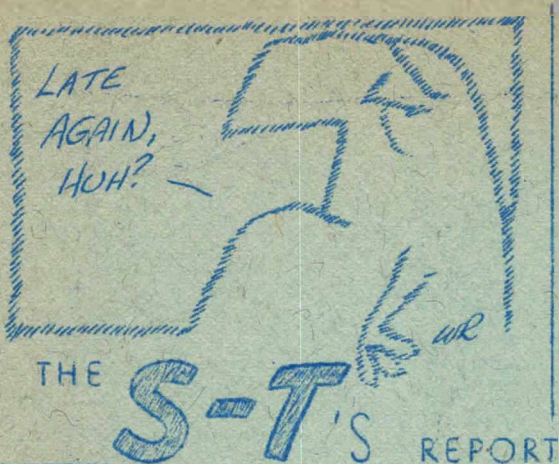

Mostly comments on the Veop's report. The egoboo poll was designed to run on the calendar year. Counting votes for material out of the four 1972 bundles, however consistently done, is patently unfair to the membership at large who took pains to vote within the proper limitations. Similarly, the reason the ballot is included in the February mailing of the following year is to prevent discrimination against the November mailing, since in order to get the poll sheet off in time many members would not have time to read the November mailing before voting if that mailing contained the ballot. Also, 3 points for voting has not been the custom in recent years: 10 points have been given since 1970. The egoboo poll does not need change as much as truly consistent application.
