THE MEMBERSHIP

ATM - Any activity owed must be in this May mailing, or a prior postmailing not yet received by me. If you missed the mailing your only method to remain a member is to circulate a petition.

\$ - Your dues were due in my hands no later than May 9. As of the date this roster is being typed - 25 April - they have not been received.

The petition to waive activity requirements for Burbee received 24 signatures (which is sufficient) including (in no particular order) Boggs, Marion, Goldberg, Evans, Fitch, Cox, Pelz, Moffatts, Burns, Glycer, Scrivner, Moudry, Pavlats, Lillian, Porter, Stone, Warner, Calkins, Glicksohn, Wesson, Perdue, McPhail, Widner, and Raeburn.

We disallowed activity credit for Porter's STARSHIP in the February mailing on the basis that it did not qualify as "amateur" within the meaning of the Fapa constitution. Porter was so advised, and a copy of the letter was sent to Vice President Cox. If Andy has appealed our action you'll find the details in Cox's report.

A couple of members in the last mailing provided a surprisingly minimal amount of material as representing their impression of "eight pages." Fapa is based on the idea of fanzine exchanges, with eight pages set as an acceptable annual minimum. Each one of you knows what an honest eight pages is.

Funds on deposit currently total \$257.33, so we are still operating in the red. Fapa netted \$59 on the surplus stock sale, yet the true Fapa balance of funds on hand before advances and exclusive of deposits increased only by \$10 from the February report to this report. (That figure is \$29 in February, \$39 now. This report is three weeks before the mailing deadline, the last report was two weeks before deadline, and that extra week may bring in up to about \$20 in dues currently owed.) In short, dues aren't covering costs.

I mentioned the oversea mailing rate increase. Pelz tells me cost/bundle went from \$1.25 in November to \$3.31 in February. Sixteen of our members receive mailings at this \$3.31 rate. Thirteen of those get their FA sent by air, at 80¢ per copy for the last FA (the three in Canada don't.) Hills and Stone, who had their entire mailing sent air, are of course credited with the 80¢ Fapa would otherwise pay to send their FA air as well as with the \$3.31 surface rate for the rest of the mailing.

We should get through the year without an assessment. But we need another dues increase. Vote for it in August.

FILING FOR OFFICE

Candidates for office should file with the Pavlats as soon as possible. July 25th is a reasonable deadline. You nominate yourself. Election ballots will be in the August mailing, and this is your once-a-year chance to seize Fapa power. Don't hesitate, do it now.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE FAPA CONSTITUTION:

Having followed the procedures set forth in 8.1, Peggy Rae Pavlat, Bob Pavlat, Harry Warner Jr., Norm Metcalf and Charles Hansen have signed and submitted the following motions. (All signers to all motions). The amendments will be voted on in the annual election, as in 8.1, which should allow adequate time for the members to consider them.

(A) Replace the present section 2.4 of the FAPA constitution with the following:

"2.4 New members who have not satisfied renewal credential requirements in or before the fourth mailing of their membership shall not receive said fourth mailing and their membership will be immediately terminated. No portion of their first year dues is refundable."

This amendment, if adopted, shall be effective for memberships which commenced in May 1981 or later. /continued inside last page/

(B) Replace the present section 3.1 of the constitution with the following:

"3.1 To renew his or her membership a member must have renewal credentials. Renewal credentials are a contribution in the form of prose, verse, drawings, or at least one issue of a fantasy amateur publication (fanzine) for which the member had substantial responsibility for content and format. Renewal credentials must total eight 8½ x 11 pages or the equivalent in page area. Renewal credentials must be distributed in FAPA mailings or postmailings during the year that ends with the deadline for the fourth quarterly mailing under the member's membership year. The following materials do not serve as renewal credentials: Postmailings mailed after the deadline for the fourth mailing of the member's membership year; Reprints, unless they represent substantial work in rewriting or compilation; Letters; Materials distributed outside of FAPA more than three months before their inclusion in a FAPA mailing."

(C) Amend the first sentence of section 4.1 to read: "Dues are \$12.00 per year, payable in United States funds."

(D) Replace the present section 7.4 of the constitution with the following: "More than two consecutive elective terms in the same office are prohibited for the offices of President and Vice-President."
