In an interview with Mr. Abraham Goodman, of RED CIRCLE pubs, we learned that MARVEL TALES will be temporarily discontinued. Said Goodman: "MARVEL TALES will be temperarily discontinued, and you can quote me on that". "If resumed, it will be back to a strict science policy. The matter is under pareful consideration. If we decide to resume the magazine, we will have a surprise for all readers of science fiction."

This will probably be good news to all fans who have deplored MAR-VEL'S degeneration. According to its publishers, the first issue of MARVEL SCIENCE STORIES sold very well, but the circulation of every following number dropped steadily until it dropped below the point of reasonable profit.

Confirming this report by telephone conversation with Mr. Erisman also of MARVEL, we learned that the suspension of MARVEL is only temporary, and is due to the present conaitions of the pulp market. In all probability, publication will be resumed within nine months, if condiions improve.
