## PHILIP FRANCIS NOWLAN, EATOR OF "BUCK ROGERS".

## - VINCENT, NOTED AUTHOR ESCING INN.Y. HOSPI

PHIL NOWLAN'S DEATH ANNOUNCED BY JOHN W. CAMPBELL, JR. EDITOR OF ASTOUNDING S-F AT QUEENS SFL MEETING

At the Queens Science Fiction League meeting last Sunday. John W. Campbell. Jr., Editor of ASTOUNDING SCIENCE FICTION, announced the death on the day before (Saturday) of Phil Nowlan, creator of Buck Rogers in the 25th Century, and one of the best known, though lately inactive science fiction authors.

The information was relayed to Mr. Campbell and your Fantasy Reporter via Mr. L. Sprague DeCamp, who attended the meeting accompanied by his wife.

The announcement was geceived with complete silence, and came as a shock and a surprise to all pressent who know that Mr. Nowlan was planning a come-back, and had already submitted several stories to current stf mags, some of which will see print soon. A 20,000 word novel will be published in the May issue of ASTOUNDENG SCIENCE FICTION and will be the cover atory.

MALCOLM JAMESON, POPULAR AUTHOR, MAKES ANNOUNCEMENT AT QSFL MEETING.

At last S unday's Queens Science Fiction League Meeting, Mr. M alcolm Jameson, well-liked author of articles and stories in current pro stf mags, announced the convalescence of Harl Vincent, who has writtend probablymore stf yarns than any other single author, in N ew York Hospital, Rockefeller Center, from acute peritonitus.

Mr. Vincent has had many stories of excellent quality appearing currently in all the better stf mags, and has staged a successful comeback since his inactivity of a few years ago. He attributes a great deal of his renewed enthusiasm to the ovation he received at the recent WORLD SCIENCE FICTION where it was pointed out that he has more stf yarns published than any other author.
