A. MERRITT IS DEAD!

NOTED AUTHOR & EDITOR
DIES SUDDENLY:

Abraham Merritt, author of many weird tales and science fiction yarns, died of a heart attack on August 21st, at Indian Rocks Beach, Clearwater, Florida. He was on vacation, having arrived from New York the day before.

Mr. Merritt was the editor of the American Weekly, a weekly newspaper magazine section, which featured many off-trail natural history and archeological articles. Occasional stf was also published under Mr. Merritt's direction including the celebrated "Ark Of Fire".

His collection of books on demonology, magic, ancient history and archeology was put to good use by the author in writing his many famous yarns. Among those best remembered are "Through the Dragon Glass", "The Moon Pool", "The Metal Emperor", "The Ship Of Ishtar", "The Witch Mother", "The People Of the Pit", "Seven Footprints To Satan", "Dwellers In the Mirage", "Creep Shadow", etc. It is remored that he had many other novels left incomplete through lack of time. It is a fact that he was never satisfied with his "Metal Monster" later renamed "The Metal Emperor", and hoped to put this novel into satisfactory shape some day.

He supported many fan ventures such as Fantasy Magazine, contributing many articles and stories. His loss is mourned by readers and fans alike.

For two issues in a row now well have had to present sad news. First we reported the passing of UNKNOWN, a pro mag whose line-up of offtrail fantasy has been unique in the history of stf. And now we have to mourn the end of Abrahan Merritt, a master of fantasy and sclentifiction,

Thile the work of Howard Philips Lovecraft may have been said to be the logical development of the work of Edgar Allen Poe and a polished gem of fine art, the work of A. Merritt received the highest form of flattery in that it was imitated but never approached. For mastery of touch and cosmical grandeur, Merritt's work was unsurpassed,

Though he was never satisfied with it, his long novel, "The Metal Monster", later renamed "The Metal Emperor", may be said to be his masterpiece. For delicacy and exquisite description and poignance of plot, his "Moon Pool" shines above all other scientific fantasy. And his first published story, "Through the Dragon Glass" showed even then the ability of the master in the numbering of recent issues that was to be.

A collection of Merritt's worksare correct: would be invaluable, and it is to be hoped that a progressive publisher such as Arkham House will see fit to publisher a complete collection, not only for its artistic worth but also for its value as a possible best seller. Such a collection should enjoy a wide sale.
