BARDIC CIRCLE: A CIRCLE in which everyone takes turns at being the performer, going consecutively around the CIRCLE.

BFA: Short for "Banned from Argo," a humorous Star Trek song by Leslie FISH, probably the best-known FILK(song) there is (though her "Hope Cycle," a serious song about the Moon landings, is about as well-known, and is the unofficial anthem of the FILK community). It's fashionable to express disdain for BFA (much as one would for a pun). THE FISH says she'll sing it only once a year at a con.

CHAOS: A CIRCLE in which everyone jumps in whenever they feel like it. Works best with experienced FILK(sing)ers who know each other, and have finely developed FILK etiquette. Obviously, this is open to FILKHOGGING.

CIRCLE: Performance FILK(singing) (compare with HYMNAL FILK(ing), below) is customarily done by people seated in a circle facing the center ("The FILKers are attacking! Form the chairs into a circle!"), taking turns performing.

C-JAM: The instrumental form of FILK(sing) -- or, if you prefer, the FILK version of jazz. Popularized by Heather Alexander. The performer who's up names a tune, or demonstrates a chord progression. Each member of the CIRCLE, in turn, performs a solo riff on it, while the others back them up with the chords.

DANDELION: A button often worn by FILK(sing)ers, to signal their identity as FILK(sing)ers to others. The weed invokes the days when FILK(sing)ers were a persecuted minority at cons (and they aren't now?), & had to FILK wherever they could.

EOFILK: Jack Speer published an early (the earliest?) collection of FILK(song)s for the 1940 Chicago WorldCon (the second ever held). If 1950s stuff is PALEOFILK, for his he favors the term EOFILK ("The Dawn of FILK" -- cue the tympani).

FILK: derives from "folk," and dates from the 1950s (the songs themselves go back to at least 1940). Beyond that, accounts of its origin differ. A FILK(song) is a science-fictional folksong. Has been extended to cover any song adopted by FILK(sing)ers. Also, a FILK can be such a song, or a session at which such songs are sung. To FILK can be to participate in such a session; or as a transitive verb to parody (an existing song), or to serenade (an -- often unwilling -- group with FILKsongs).

FILKHOGGING: The practice of monopolizing more than one's share of performance time. Many FILK(sing)ers wear buttons with the interogational red circle and slash superimposed on a pig's face: "No FILKhogging!"

FILKMEISTER: A moderator at a FILK(sing), who determines who performs when. One solution to FILKHOGGING.

FISH, THE: Leslie Fish, generally regarded as the most professional of FILK(sing)ers

FOLLOW: A song that fits particularly well after another song. E.g., if someone does Jeff Duntmann's "Outer Space Marines," a good follow might be Filky Pierre's "Space Navy Song," which ends, "Just think -- we could be stuck in the Marines."

FOUND FILK: a song not originally created as a FILK(song), but meeting someone's definition of FILK. Weird Al Yankovic's stuff is the classic example. Also Bastard King of England, Teddy Bear's Picnic, Lord of the Dance, Engineers' Song, etc.

FRANK HAYES DISEASE: The tendency to forget the words to a song you've written while performing it. Reverse of Tom Smith, who makes up the words as he goes along

HYMNAL: An omnibus collection of FILKsongs, typically sung in unison by an entire group, in the manner of hymns in church. The organizers of such a session will typically provide everyone with a loaner copy (as to church). When a hymnal exists in 2 volumes (like the NESFA Hymnal, or the WesterFILK, or the HOPSFA Hymnal), the first volume is referred to as the "Old Testament" (Let's sing page 56 in the Old Testament, next!), and the second as the New. It may be done CHAOS style, or there may be a leader who resolves disputes as to what to sing next; but nobody is a featured performer on any number.

MICROFILK: A collection of 552 FILKs, printed in extremely small type, by Erwin S. (Filky Pierre) Strauss. A total of 666 copies were produced, and it went out of print in 1983. It's available for download at: www.floatingfilk.com/mp3/microfilk.pdf.

OSE: Term derived from "morose": "Some songs are more 'ose' than others." Refers to particularly sad, tragic, maudlin FILK(song)s, in which everything ends badly.

PALEOFILK: Usually refers to FILK dating back to the 1950s and 1960s.

PICK PASS OR PLAY: When it's your turn, you typically have the options of playing (performing a number), picking (asking someone else to perform) or passing (letting the turn pass to the next person).

POKER CHIP CIRCLE: Invented by Lee and Barry Gold. Everyone gets a poker chip at the start of a round, and when they want a turn, they throw their chip in the center. When all chips have been thrown in, a new round begins. This allows people to jump in when they want to (eg, when they have a good FOLLOW), without waiting for their turn; while at the same time insuring against FILKHOGGING.

RISE UP SINGING: An omnibus collection of folksongs, generally showing chordings. Many FILK(song)s use these tunes, so it's a nearly-indispensable item for FILK(sing)ers. Sometimes for a change of pace, FILK(sing)ers may forsake FILK, and do a HYMNAL-style sing of the (straight) folksongs.

ROTR: "Real Old Time Religion," a parody of "Old Time Religion" singing the praises of Greco-Roman, Norse and other gods, typically pre-dating Christianity.

SHOW-STOPPER: A very brief FILK(song), typically inserted during the process of assembling a HYMNAL to fill a blank space at the end of a page. E.g., (to the tune of Exodus, and presented here in its entirety): There are some things man was not meant to know, and songs man was not meant to sing. And this is one of them.
