To clear up any mis-interpretions, the editor's of "Futurian OFDERVER", in their capacity as officals of the F.S.S., wish to release the following statement.

At the 10th meeting of the Society it was decided to edit a club organ. All members were unanamous in agreement that the idea of issueclub ing a club magazine was excellent. However, between the 10th and 11-2 meeting, Director Veney discussed this matter with the majority of club members with the object of finding what support would forthcoming only to reach the conclusion that many vere hazy minded as to what t∴e entire scheme was to embrace. Some held the opinion that independent fan publications should be dropped in favour of the combined effort. Others thought the club magazine should be real released to nembers only. A third group favoured merely a news sheet devoted entirely r.... activities while a fourth group west so far as to say it sh to should be based on professional lines and aiming at bookstall circulation. In view of so much controversy the only logical course to follow would be to again discuss the matter and pounder out the difficulties. This was done at the illth meeting and then a ballot was taken on the revised notion, the proposal was defeated by 6 votes to 4, with one informal, a majority of one. Friedlander, who didn't show sufficient interest interest to sttend this meeting, upon hearing the result of this vote, gave secretary Castellari his resignation.
