Hello, Everyone--

Yes, I am alive. No, I am not dead. However, I came close to booking out of the hotel twice.

To bring everyone up to date, this is what happened...<<very much edited - it was many pages, sorry, kg>>

The weekend after Halloween, I went to bed on that Saturday night feeling like my regular self. I woke up on Sunday morning with what I describe as an "exploded left leg." The left leg was swollen triple its normal size; it was red hot; I had a fever of 104 degrees; and the pain in the leg was something like having ten or twelve red hot branding irons applied to it.

I was in horrible pain; in semi-delirium; not making a lot of sense, etc. Being the usual smart ass that I am, I refused to go to the hospitals. I was convinced that they would truly kill me there. My roommate Jerry Verdot stayed by my bedside for 36 hours and with all his skill, brought my fever down to 101 degrees. We called the doctor, got oral antibiotics, and instructions to keep me in bed with legs elevated as this was cellulitis. ... after a week of struggling with pain, the leg erupted into a mass of open, draining wounds both front and back. Chere Belknap finally took me to Jewish Hospital on the night of the second Monday in November. An MRI scan revealed a crescent moon-shaped pocket of fluid in the back of the calf, wrapped around the large muscle. ... Eventually, they cultured one of the draining sites, and it grew a rare

infectious organism resistant to most drugs. It would respond to only certain antibiotics. I was placed IN ISOLATION, and a new drug was hooked up. I was running high, cyclic fevers (going up to 101 degrees by four in the afternoon), and the insurance company determined that my hospitalization was not medically necessary (lawsuit in progress), and I was booted out of the hospital.

Once home, I was bedridden and still in horrific pain. ... I was utterly out of it. My memory went. My sense of continuity went. My concentration went. Life was slow motion. ...The following people have done these things for me, and they have my humble gratitude and love: My mother David Szuch and Dawn Marie Blades Jerry Verdot Chere Belknap Ron Schaerer Ollie Langhorst Pam Machold Michelle Neubauer. Without the care and constant attention of these powerful people, I would be dead.

For weeks, I did not eat and was not in my right mind. My blood pressure plummeted; I suffered from shattering palsy-like shaking and chills known as rigors. My eyes rolled around in my head, and my teeth chattered. My body temperature could not be regulated and ultimately, I suffered a massive, systemic allergic reaction to the IV drug. I broke out in what amounted to a second or third degree chemical burn all over my body--from the top of my head to the bottoms of my feet. I was taken off the IV drug ... I wound up in the doctor's office with a blood pressure of 80/40, lost consciousness there, and was evacuated via ambulance from his office to the Emergency Room where I remained for six hours on various IV's--I bordered on hypovolemic shock, and the fear was that my heart would stop beating.

The following day, I underwent a tap of the fluid in my leg under ultrasound technique. ...they never were able to grow out the offending organism in my blood; however, gram stains revealed a gram positive cocci, and Infectious Disease specialists put me on a new oral drug, which I am still taking. Just before Christmas, a urine culture revealed a rare organism in my bladder, and I was medicated with IV drugs again for a week. Two days before Christmas, I was finally able to sit up and eat.

Currently, I am off blood pressure medicine in an attempt to maintain a blood pressure to support my heart beat. I am on oral drugs for the infection in the leg. The condition of my skin over 98% of my body is very poor--I have some burns that are quite severe. I am in the process of rehabilitating. I shake sometimes without warning or control. My hand-eye coordination is very poor. Typing on the computer is good for me, but slow going. I am very weak. ... My leg will require surgery in the spring; the vascular surgeon has determined that this is an abscess which will have to be drained, but the current condition of the leg is too poor ... My body temperature is still out of control--I get cold quite often. My concentration is quite poor, and I space out rather easily. I forget things. I am on an extended medical leave from work--that is another story.

And so, there it is. I am glad to still be among the living. That is why I have not been on the computer.

Dark Lord of Derkholm by Diana Wynne Jones Review Copyright 1999 teale

Jones' must-have "Tough Guide to Fantasyland" posed as a book of rules and definitions for tours through a fantasy world. Wickedly funny, it left every reader in stitches and every would-be writer wincing at just how predictable their own work was.

"Dark Lord" is set in the "Tough Guide" world, with hundreds of mundane world tourists hacking and slashing their way through carefully choreographed clichés. A profitable business for all, you think? But: "Querida, High Chancellor of Wizards' University, has received more than one million letters from wizards, farmers, soldiers, elves, dragons, and kings, all begging her to put a stop to Mr. Chesney's Pilgrim Parties."

If not for the contract with the demon-toting Mr. Chesney, the tours would be a thing of the past. The wars between the forces of Good and Evil ruin the crops, destroy perfectly good cities, and it's a pain posing as the Beautiful Enchantress, the Wizard Guides (beards compulsory) or, especially, the Dark Lord. This year, Querida decides to try and get out of Chesney's contract and consultation with the oracles informs her that to do this she must appoint the less-than conventional wizard Derk as Dark Lord and his young son Blade as a Wizard Guide (beard still compulsory).

Despite the setting, "Dark Lord" is not a parody. It's the story of a very unusual family in a world of magic coping with a particularly trying situation, and it's brilliant. Jones is a master of her craft and utterly convincing. Few other writers could successfully create a family which included, along with the humans, a clutch of very personable griffins with dreams, aspirations and problems all their own. Not to mention the flying horses and pigs, Big Hen, and the carnivorous sheep, which Derk admits were a mistake.

It's possible to read "Dark Lord" without having read "Tough Guide," but both are so seriously recommended as absolutely essential reading that rushing out and buying both (and a spare set or two for friends) straight away is the only acceptable solution. You'll never think about leathery-winged avians in quite the same way again.

Turner Network Television (TNT) has commenced production on CRUSADE, the highly anticipated new series from the creators of the Emmy Award- and Hugo Award-winning series Babylon 5. Gary Cole, Tracy Scoggins, Daniel Dae Kim, David A. Brooks, Marjean Holden, Carrie Dobro and Peter Woodward will head the cast of CRUSADE, which is set to launch on the network in 1999. Douglas Netter and series creator J. Michael Straczynski will executive-produce for Babylonian Productions.

CRUSADE begins after a savage attack on Earth by the Drakh, allies of the evil Shadows. Earth's humans have succeeded in defeating the alien force, but not its final revenge: a biogenetic plague that will eliminate all human life on Earth, unless a cure can be found. The White Star fleet -- led by the advanced prototype warship Excalibur -- combs the ruins of races far more advanced than humans to find the cure that will save them.

"Crusade": The Great Network Swap !!!

Okay folks. Babylon 5 and Crusade creator J. Michael Straczynski has posted some information to the Internet, which has...more or less....helped explain what has been happening the last few days on Crusade.

Yesterday, Coaxial News reported Crusade was canceled. Crusade has not been canceled. Rather, canceled is too strong a word at the moment. Production on the show has been suspended, to allow for paperwork, negotiations, etc. to take place. In theory, production will resume later next week - or early the following week. - What kind of paperwork, negotiations, etc.?

TNT has not been entirely happy with the show, and the producers haven't been entirely happy with TNT. All of this has become evident over the last few months. As such, TNT is no longer interested in the

show. Efforts are currently underway to find a new "distributor" for the show. In short, TNT will likely not be airing Crusade, and...after the dust settles...it could well end up on The Sci Fi Channel, for example.

In fact, writing, e-mailing, and calling The Sci Fi Channel might be a very good idea right about now...

Is there a chance the show might not get picked up by another network? ... Yes, there is a chance the show might not get picked-up by another network. HOWEVER, **all** indication are extremely high the Crusade will quickly find a new home, and can then resume production as usual.

What does Warner Bros. have to say about all of this? Warner Bros. is characterized as working feverishly to find a new home for Crusade. Whereas fans have shown some disdain towards Warner's apparent lack of commitment to Babylon 5, all indications suggest Warners is totally and completely behind Crusade in a big way.

This factor alone may well save the show. Also, expect more periphery support for Crusade than on Babylon 5. For example, the video releases of Crusade are likely to be much faster and more efficient than the video releases of Babylon 5. And yes, the initials DVD have been spoken...

So, that should pretty much bring you guys up to where things are at the moment. As I promised in last night's post, I will let you know when it's time to worry. Right now, worrying will not do anyone any good.

Again, expressing your support for Crusade to the Sci Fi Channel would probably be a fair and reasonable gesture at this point in time. Hint...hint...


