World of Ice, blurbed as a "Dynamic first", is featured in the March '53 Dynamic Science Fiction, currently on all stands except those within a 500 mile radius of Albert's home, where they are completely sold out.

His Science and Insanity and his Nightmare have been bought by Vortex Science Fiction, and The Last Time I Saw Paris taken by Fantastic Worlds.

He achieved "international" recognition when his Smiler was pirated in Mexico, translated into Spanish and published in the 41st issue of Los Cuentos Fantásticos.

Albert has a dozen new stories on editors' desks at this very moment, and--what will come as a pleasant surprise to him--he has made his first British sale: Only Human will appear in a future issue of Authentic Science Fiction.

When not busy managing the treasury of the Los Angeles Science Fantasy Society, our Guest of Honor even finds time to read science fiction as well as write it...
