actual abrasive, and this pas done delibor ately. The idea was to grind the steel noodlo so it fitted the grote closely. If you don't believe that this grinding astion takes plaso, tako a stool noolde after one or tro piays and oxamine it thra a stroig lons. You $W i l l$ noto that the point has assumod a dofinito chisel tip. This in the roanon it is very umplas to placo back into the noodlo ohuolk a needlo anies it has boon ramovoli- you are almost surz to got it turnod so the chisol tip bocomoz a shisel in fact and it will out into tino rosord grovo and ruin tho rocord.

To follow thoory, it mas then assumed that the beat noodle would bo ono that mould NOT mear and mhioh in turn mould NOT moar tho grovo.

Jewelled needles, such as ruby, sapphire and diamond, came into vogue and worked befter than the steel noedle, but the grat woight of the oldifashionod acoustio plekup, and later on the somerhet less, though still excessively hoavy eloctric ploknp, still caused rocord wear.

Current practise is to use a pickup that is either so light, or so mell counterbalanced as to exert pressure on the rem oord on the arder of only a fow grams-m some of the better pickups exert a noedla point pressure of the order of 3 to 5 grams, bolieve it or not. Combino this light pressure with a prectous metal nodile, or a sapphira noodie, or a diamond tip, and you will find that oven after many thousands of plays there is no apparant wear either with the neodlo or With the record.

A new piokup I have boen reading aboutit is not yet availablo comorciallyexerts a tip prossure of 1.5 grams, uses a diamond tip noedle, and oven aftor 100,000 piays noither rersond nor noodlo showed any signs of wear! The frequenoy rosponse of the pickup is roughly 10 to. 50,000 ope. The voltage output is around 01. L proamplifior is nocossary betwoon It and tho conventional ampilifior.

Non for Pharner's coments on spoakers: tho following I am quoting from mancry from various artialos I havo read. Tirst the hi-fi stuff. I road rooontly in ono
of. the formost U.S radio trado magazines that docent hi-fi results oan be obtained using a poor man's sotup using the cheapest type of spoakers. It seems, and I'll admit this mas a rovolation to me though, to be frank, I had suspocted somothing of the sort for a long time, that the littlo 4" speaker such as is used in Auntie Hortenso's Horriblo Pipsquoak (\$4.95 and a couple of boxtops) will reproduce froquoncios as high as $10,000 \mathrm{cps} . \dot{1}$ But its lon frequency response is torriblo. It just simply mon't get down bolon 100 or maybe even 150 cps . And thet:s mhore tho jazz boys and tho hiwfi hound start baying- "liston to that boom boomd" thoy yodel in the hills. So, it is suggested, buy a $12^{\prime \prime}$ or a 14 " speaker which will get down to about 50 or 60 ops , or buy an $18^{\prime \prime}$ and get domn to maybe 40 ops. Hook the two up with a crossmoter network anad you have a praotical hi-fi outfit at on ordinary man's prico.

Of courso - to have this extended range of perhaps $50 \mathrm{~m}, 000$ or $10,000 \mathrm{cps}$., yeu have to have a plokup with that fidelity and boys they cost doughd and the audio transformers in your amplifier will also set you baok. And plenty. That's the joker in all this hi-fi biz: a joo comes a.long and says his circuit will reproduce 30-10,000 cps. Fine, you say, I'll build me ono of those. But God: Have mercy upon us- the price is terrible. And when you stert getting down to 30 cps , or even 40 cps , the lan of diminishing returns comes into the picturo-- A practical hum filtar notwork can be built fairly reasonably that will make an outfit sound hum free if you aren't going down below 50 cps . Eut for every extra 10 ops below that, your trouble with filter hum, and your battlo to eliminate it, grows alnost at the rate of square root proportions.

And thls sturf about push pull triode outputs- push-pull pentódes, beam power tubes, with proper negative feedwack, can give you the same curve within reason. In fact, it can be oarried to the point where your reproduction is so flat from 50-10,000 ops it sounds like hell. I read once an article where this guy built a slagle ended job that gave almost the same fidelity, using negative

## feedback, of course.

TII so to all the expense to bulld super hiffi outfits? Is it nocesmany? You build a lovely job with a flat response from, exy, 30-I5,000 ops. And then what do you dn? You add a so-called tone control. ..... fior see even a commeroial job without ono? "So thet the tone can be adjusted to suit the indiridual" says the-blurb. What doos a bass tore control du? It actually is a "losser" control-- you meraly bypass all: tho $z e$ love? y hari-mon highs so that the output sounäs as though tho bass had boon boosted. Why bilild an exponsive outfit if you are going to stiois a tone control on it?

Why not just build somothing that makes muaic sounds good to you? Build it so you Qan ilsten to it hour aftor hour without fatigue. Anything more mon!t give you any pore pleasuro, and it will probably oost a lot less.
