

SUGG STIOLS FOR THE SIXTH

THE FIRST was held in Philadelphia in 1935 under the auspices of New York and Philadelphian fans. It established the notion of holding conventions. It let the New York fans see the Philadelphians for the first time (and did they get drunk on the way back).

The SECOID was neld in lew York in 1936; the lew York fans presided. This was the first Convention to invite authors and editors. It was the first to show movies and to serve woulfet supper.

The T. TRD was held in Failadelphia in 1977. Philadelphians presiding. It. broke all precedents in st. by introducing. Eichel's suggestion that the Jako us

The rough was held in Lewarz in 1938. Lostowitz and Sykora ruled. It was the first Convention at which de locatic procedure was curtailed. It saw the end of the "revive the I.S.A." movements.

The FIFTH was hald in New York in 1939. The executive committee of New Fandom dominated. This was the first Convention not to include a democratic discussion period on the agenda. It was the first to bur any lans. It was also the first to have a "popular science" lecture.
