The reason for this is a single foolscap sheet it's calling itself "Australian Science Fiction Newservice Ltd", and dealing with an unqualified satire on the "First Sydney Convention". Both Taylor & myself, and as far as I can guess, most native fans received one of those a week or more ago - a Friday as I remember. The envelope had no identification mark on it, the only thing being the postmark - "Brunswick, Vic." This immediately threw suspicion on Marshall L. MacLennan, but as you will understand later on, he could not have been responsible!!!! Well, the Sunday after I received the sheet, I got a letter from Ron Levy, in which he stated that he suspected me as being responsible for it, that I had posted it in Brunswick to throw suspicion from myself onto Marsh MacLennan.
