possibility of a sequel, which in itself is not a bad thing but in this age of sequels it would be nice to have a story to stand on its own two feet without being a lead-in to another book. However, I found the story overall to be satisfying.

2010: ODYSSEY TWO starts only a few years after the end of its predecessor both in publication date and in story time. Heywood Floyd, the now ex-chairman of the Mational Council on Astronautics is the protagonist of this story. He learns of a plan by the Soviet Union to send a ship to Jupiter to "rescue" or salvage the spaceship DISCOVERY, left as a derelict when David Bowman, its last remaning crewman was drawn into the black monolith at Jupiter. Before I go any further, Clarke has written the book so that it conforms more with the movie than the novel of the same mame. After some machinations, Floyd; Chandra, the creator of HAL 9000 and its twin SAL 9000; and an engineer named Curnow are invited by the Russians to go on the ship ALEXI LEONOV to the region of Jupiter and found out, if possible, what happened to Bowman and HAL, and try to recover the ship. The story is weel told and is a worthy sequel to its forerunner.

Of the two novels I found 2010 the more satisfying and more engrosssing. This has been the opinion of the reviews I have read. This should provide more fuel to the friendly feud between these giants in the SF Field.

BOOK REVIEWS

MALL WORLD by Somtow Sucharitkul (Rod Morrow)

MALL WORLD is a series of short stories that garnered the John W. Campbell Award for "Best New Science Fiction Writer" for the author, Somtow Sucharitkul. All seven stories in MALL WORLD take place in a future in which our first extraterrestrial visitors are the blue skinned, purple haired, humanoid Selespridar who imprison mankind by placing a force field around our Solar System just outside the orbit of Saturn until such time as Homo Sapiens achieves maturity and is fit to join the rest of the galaxy. Adding insult to imprisonment the force field blacks out the stars which serves as a constant reminder of the loss of freedom.

The Selespridar, not being total blue meanies, are very geneous with their technology which allows the creation of Mallworld, a "thirty kilometer long shopping center between the asteroids and Jupiter", where

you can get literally anything you want.

Each story is told from a different characters' viewpoint ranging from a "lonely, unsatisfied, bible-belt virgin, teenage girl" to Julian bar Julian XIII, the owner of Mallworld. They all share the frustration of not being able to seek their destiny in the stars, so they seek the diversions available at Mallworld.

Mallworld and the future scenario that Mr. Sucharitkul has created are wide open for many stories to come. Mr. Sucharitkul's writing style

is easily read and full of subtle satire and humor.

MALLWORLD is one of the STARBLAZE editions, (available direct from: The Donning Co.,5659 Virginia Beach Blvd, Norfolk, Va. 23502) in oversize softcover, and illustrated by Karl Kofoed. I will add, for those of you who have read most of the stories in Isaac Asimov's SF Magazine; there is one never before published story in the book "The Jaws of Mallworld" which is one of the best in the series.

FOUNDATION'SEDGE by Isaac Asimov (Frank Jorda) 2010: ODYSSEY TWO

These two much awaited books arivved within days of each other, and they were well workt the wait.

FOUNDATION'S EDGE starts about two hundred or so years after the end of SECOND FOUNDATION and involves two main characters, Golan Trevize from the First Foundation and Stor Gendibal, a Speaker of the Second Foundation. Both believe that the Seldon Plan is not working by noting that the Plan is working only too well. There seems to be no deviation from the Plan and this disturbs them as being "unnatural". One would expect some minor flaws in the workings of the Plan in five hundred year, but there arenone. Trevize suspects that the Second Foundation is behind thisperfection in the plan, but the First Föundation believes it has destroyed the Second. For his views, Trevize is exiled from Terminus, the capitol of the First Foundation. His ticket to return home is to find some evidence of the Second. Stor Gendibal, on the other had can show that the Plan has been tampered with through the use of mathematics. He is also manuvered into leaving his home planet in order to find out who is tampering with the Plan. The two stories are interwoven effectively and if there is a flaw in the book it is the conclusion of the story. It leaves too many questions unanswered and leaves open a
