CLUB NEWS:: Meetings of the Sydney Science Fiction Foundation now coincide with meetings of the newly-formed Melbourne Science Fiction The first meeting of the latter (last Friday) was attended by about 15 fins of various types, which is not too bad a showing giventhe lack of public transport on that day, In typical Melbourne fashion no constituti n and drawn up, no office is elected and no dues set. However it was accepted as an unwritten rule that all meatings must be held within easy walking distance of a pub; as too many members forget vital equipment for the meetings. John Bangsund claimed that he lived near enough, so the next meeting (Soptember 4) will be held at Flat 1, 8 Bundalohn Court, St. Kilda. The meeting after that will probably be held in the Degraves Tavern Mombers expressed some dissatisfaction with MSFS as a title for the group searched around for something with dignity and snap. 'Returned Starmon's League' was about as far as we got on the dignity side. 'The Illustrated Men' was popular until the proposer made it plain that totops were essential. Three issues of QUARGER MERKUR orrived from Franz Rottonsteiner FANZINES:: (A-2762 Ortmann, Felsonstr. 20, All mia, 2 DM oach), number 20, 21 and 23, number 22 having arrived some montes ago, Each issue runs 86 A4 pages. Num or 20 contains 'Reversed Worlds' (by Rottensteiner) which is quite wideranging, various other articles (mostly reprinted) and 31 pages of reviews, and letters, the reviews being mainly of Elnglish-language books. Number 21 contains Lem's Pobots in Science Fiction ' (already reprinted in JOE 3) and David I Masson's article on language in SF (reprinted in SPECULATION), several other articles and 26 pages of reviews (oh, there's an article on SF in Hungary by Poter Kuczka which mentions Frigyes Karinthy soveral times - I reprinted part of one of his works in SATURA back in1964). Number 23 has an article by Lem on the general nature of SF, and 222 page Lem bibliography prepared by Rottensteiner as well as the usual serving of book reviews.
