The task of the Organizational Committee is to develop procedures for The Timebinders. This involves such interesting questions as:

- 1. "How does someone become a member" (de facto to date, show interest in the goals and activities of The Timebinders, but makes a membership list rather interesting)
- 2. "How do decisions get made" (de facto to date, issue comes up and someone decides to make it happen or issue comes up and it gets bounced to me (at that point I've either made the decision or consulted with several people and gotten their feedback then made the decision, depending on the decision in question))
- 3. "What is the structure of the organization" (at the first Gathering, we spent the entire three days working very, very hard on figuring out how to get a handle on what needed to be done and how to get things moving. One of the issues we tackled was the organizational options. At that time, we decided that we'd try to "get some things done" and then let the organization follow from that activity.) (de facto has been to punt)

Since in practice each physical gathering of The Timebinders has had a vastly different cast of characters, we need a mechanism for participation by all of those interested. (Unless Don Fitch was at the Tropicon Gathering, I don't think anyone has been to all of the Gatherings.)

Issues: participation if rarely travel, but have access to email participation if do not have access to email but can travel regularly participation if do not have access to email and do not travel regularly possible role for FHAPA as basis for participation

- 4. "How are officers selected" consensus the first time, see # 3 for problems which need to be addressed by the Organizational Committee.
- 5. "Financial Issues" de facto is that if someone has wanted to make something happen, they have paid for it. (The first gathering charged \$30 to cover most of the costs incurred for the weekend.) (One additional exception to the pay for it yourself model was never completed) We've mostly managed to finess the issue of costs and dues by having other conventions offer to have FanHistoricon/A Gathering of The Timebinders co-locate with them.

Everyone interested is invited to contribute their ideas. It will be necessary to forge a consensus within the larger group, so that might as well start sooner rather than later. If this were an easy task, it would have been done already! The concept is to have a long enough time frame so that ideas can adequately be discussed by snail mail correspondence as well as those conversations which can take place in person or by email. The Organizational Committee is being chaired by Leah Smith (send her hard copy by snail mail until she tells you

to send email!). Judy Bemis, Assistant to the Chair and general Nudge on this topic. Other members of the Organizational Committee are: Joe Siclari, Mark Olson, Nick Polak and Nigel Rowe.

I'd suggest that until the Organizational Committee decides on its own procedures that ideas should be sent to each member of the committee, to Lindsay Crawford and Faye Manning for inclusion in FHAPA at 4056 Southway Loop Sringfield OR 97478-5928 and to the Timebinders listserve.

We'll have a preliminary discussion of the committee's work at L.A.con III and expect to take final action at LoneStarCon2.
