The Cutlander Society was formed Oct. 2nd. 1948. No offical officers or rules. All members must live in the Los Angeles area, but not withen the L.A. City limits. Mrs. Freddie Hershey serves as forst Treasurer, Rick Sneary, final one. Membership started with 8, and rased to 14-18, at end.. Informal, social gathering. Group activity ended in 1954-55.. -- Editorship of magazine rotated, but entire group worked on it.. Was sent out as a gen-zine--- but used material by the members almost exclusively. (letters of comment, excepted.)
