APAc: Len Bailes reports he has been elected to the post of Apa Manager of the TERREAN AMATEUR PRESS SOCIETY, formed in December of 1964. The APA operates somewhat like the Cult, publishing a monthly letterzine similar to the Fantasy Rotator. ++ The February FAPA mailing was 404 pages (officially), and included MYRTLE REBECCA DOUGLAS: AN APPRECIATION, by Uncle 520 -- definitely one of the best items of the mailing. There was also a large Fantasy Rotator, AVANC 8, from Dick Eney -- included so that all the Honorary members (=non-Cultist FAPAns recently granted Honorary Membership so everyone would get thrown out of FAPA if Rick Sneary's anti-Cultist amendment passes in FAPA.) would get the FR. The Egoboo Poll showed Terry Carr in first place, Rotsler in 2nd, and Warner in 3rd (536, 423, and 418 points, respectively). HORIZONS and LIGHTHOUSE took top fanzine honors (126, 120); Speer and Warner were Top MC writers (114, 106); Warner wrote the best articles (107 to Rotsler's 67), and the best fiction or poetry (53 to TCarr's 43); but Terry waltzed off with the Best Editor votes (125 to Boggs's 91 and Rotsler's 74). No one was dropped from FAPA this time, but Earl Kemp announced his resignation as of the mailing of FAPA 111 to the members. The WL climbed to 62, and the Treasury to \$317.40. Both look too big.
