#### Introduction

Welcome to the second edition of the Tolkien Fannish and Scholarly Activities and Publications. It was no easy task to bring this to you. Its lateness can only be attribued to the fact that I felt it rather necessary to annotate (and read) all of the fanzines, newsletters and journals that I received. This makes it more practical a tool for use, but due to its bulk the reader must either mark up a copy for later reference or use various search mechanisms found on computers. There is too much information for those without photographic memories to remember (for example) just where that article on the dwarvish kingdoms was. However, problems can still arise regarding the annotations, notably the fact that they are very subjective: there is no panel of experts coming to a conclusion as to the correct wording of the synopsis. I have tried to be accurate and concise.

The greatest problems of annotating comes when a group revolves around its members who take on Tolkien names. Perhaps the most famous of these groups are the Forodrim and their publication, <u>Medlemsbladet</u>, but many of the Russian fanzines reveal a great amount of fannishness which is not easy to translate (I have been told) nor annotate.

A key should be provided now for the fanzine entries, mainly relating to the Russian and Czech entries. I have clearly identified fanzines which I have never seen, all others I have in my collection. If no contents are listed one can assume that I was not able to find someone to decipher the language and alphabet or (less likely) there is nothing Tolkien oriented in the issue. At times you will find the content items in brackets and quotes. This denotes that the item's title has been translated into English. At other times you will find the annotation in quotes. This is a translation of the item's title into English.

The entry format and criteria is (mostly) unchanged from the last edition so I will not repeat it here. As always, I am open to any new ideas which you might have. The addresses are current up to December 1994. All references to dollars are to be considered U.S. currency, unless otherwise noted.

Edouard Kloczko has kindly provided the title and cover outline. Zoltan Farkas has sent along the Hungarian Tolkien Society's logo as well which graces this year's cover. The illustration is by Janos Petro. Edouard also has suggested that a fanzine index be included in the issue, so I have provided one. I think that it is a testament to the popularity of Tolkien's works that in 1993 there were over 100 differently titled publications devoted to Tolkien in over a dozen different languages. There doesn't seem to be any slowdown, especially in the C.I.S. and surrounding countries.

Please excuse the rather crude maps in this issue. It is a concept which I am glad to see come about, however due the inexperience of the author with the available software, some of it seems overly crowded and misrepresentative. Some of this has to do with the scale of the country involved. It is easier, say, to accurately show the placement of cities in Poland than it is the United States. A single number can cover tens of miles or hundreds of miles. The idea, therefore, is to assume that these are approximate placements. I apologize to the peoples of the Czech Republic and Slovak Republic--I understand your countries are separated but the outdated software does not. Also, I realize that Ireland is not a part of the Untied Kingdom but I have had little luck convincing the computer of this fact. I have had to make a choice with the Polish entries: whether to use a different font and include the additional letters that are used Polish or to keep things consistant and ignore the problem altogether. Those of you who have a diskette copy of this will find that a single typeface is used, while the printed copy has been altered to include a different font with the additional characters. I have no right to distribute the fonts on diskette, so have avoided doing so. The choice was made clear to use a different font when I received a response from Agnieszka Sylwanowicz to my enquiry about this subject. "Whenever I read (or rather see) something Scandinavian (with crossed letters and those °s over them) in an otherwise English, or Polish, text, I'm always impressed by the editor's care and their respect for the foreign language and its users as expressed by their going to this much trouble in reproducing the specific alphabet." Not ever wanting you to think that I do not care, Agnieszka, here you are...only four hours of work!

And finally an appeal! This issue is being funded by myself. Even though I have promised a free printed copy to everyone who contributes, I fear that I cannot do this with the next issue. If you find this useful and worthwhile, I would appreciate if you could help defray any of the costs incurred. Of course, this is entirely up to you. The next issue will be available to contributors free on diskette in either Microsoft WRITE or Microsoft Word 6.0 format (thanks to Steven Deyo's donation of diskettes), however the printed copy will have to be sold (I anticipate the cost being the same as this issue).

Activities: The Czech Tolkien Society (The Society of Friends of the Work of J.R.R.Tolkien) was founded in Brno (the second largest city in the Czech Republic) in 1992 - on the date of the 100th anniversary of Tolkien's birth. We hereby present some information on these activities. The most important Society's activity seems to be the publishing of the magazines: The newsletter called The Palantír provides news on the current activities within the Society, reports of the events past and announcements of those under way, and brief articles on J.R.R. Tolkien's work and people connected with him. Thorin, the literary journal of the Society, comprises mostly the translations of passages from J.R.R. Tolkien's books unpublished so far in this country, specialized articles on Middle-Earth (including both translations and original work), reviews of the Professor's and other fantasy books and the members' own writing. It regularly includes a chapter from Basic Quenya textbook. In addition, the members of the Society, who come from different parts of both the Czech and Slovak Republics, have the opportunity to gather at regular meetings four times a year. These are: the Celebration of the Destruction of the Ring in the end of March; outdoor game motivated by The Lord of the Rings in June; the Bilbo and Frodo's Birthday in September; and last but not least, the Congress of the Czech Tolkien Society in the beginning of December in

Brno, held as a part of the annual SF&F fans' meeting Dracon. The principal aim of the meetings is to enable close personal contact of the members; however, many enjoy the interesting lectures, exciting games and thrilling fencing tournaments held on these occasions, as well as the pompous feasts. The members of the Society are also allowed to make use of its library. It comprises all the official (and a number of unofficial) Czech publications of Tolkien's work and majority of the important writing by and about J.R.R. Tolkien available in English. In large cities, regular member's meetings are held (at places called after the English model, the smials). The other activities of the C.T.S. include maintenance and distribution of the address-list of the members, publishing of additional material, contact with the Czech publishers of Tolkien's books, the Tolkien Society in the UK and the Mythopoeic Society in the USA and work towards greater general knowledge about John Ronald Reuel Tolkien's work in the Czech Republic.

"Foreword: The Tolkien Phenomenon", pp. 2-3. It is appropriate to honor Tolkien during his centenary year due to interest in his philological work, his literature and his affect on the arts and culture.

"The Magic of Words: J.R.R. Tolkien and Finland" by Luigi de Anna, pp. 7-19. *Tolkien had a very special interest in Finnish although he was not an expert. Its sound and structure fascinated him. This and the Kalevala provided a germ for his earliest mythology, wrting and creation for an Elvish language.* 

"Familiarity and distance: Quenya's relation to Finnish" by Helena Rautala, pp. 21-31. Although Tolkien loved finnishe for its 'beauty', Quenya bear little relationship to it other than its richness in vowels and a handful of words that have similar meanings. Some works look like Finnish, other are close but have dissimilar meanings. The Quenya/Finnish consonant uses are not alike and most of Quenya seems to be Germanic/Celtic based in the way that it is constructed. A meeting of the Elvish and Finnish peoples may have brought about the similarities but neither language was based on the other.

"The Influence of Archaeology and History on Tolkien's World" by Christina Scull, pp. 33-51. Many of Tolkien's place descriptions and cultural ideas might be influenced by real world architecture and past cultures. These include (for example): the cave drawings found by North Polar Bear and palaeolithic/mesolithic paintings; Stone Age/Bronze Age barrows and lake villages (barrows and Laketown); use of slanting sides and lintel for Elvish architecture; Egyptian parallels (crowns, kingdoms, burial customs, massive statuary); late Roman Empire parallels (divided kingdom, incorporation of other outlying tribes, road systems, Pantheon/Sauron's temple in Númenor); Middle Age parallels (color naming of books, Marco-Blanco/Hengest-Horsa, warfare between kingdoms, burned manuscripts, dike creation, The Golden Hall/Norse Hall, burial mounds); minaret at Samarra, Iraq (Orthanc); and, the hidden Incan city of Vilcabamba (Gondolin). Many illustrations are included.

"Some Notes on Giants in Tolkien's Writings" by Anders Stenström, pp. 53-71. Stone-giants from <u>The Hobbit</u> are a troublesome curiousity in Middle-earth. An examination of the workd 'giant' reveals three different meanings (A) a skillful, older and wiser being than the gods, (B) stupid and dangerous enemies of God and man, and (C) a hero or champion. The word (and variants of) giant are explored in <u>The Hobbit</u>, <u>The Lord of the Rings</u>, <u>Farmer Giles of Ham</u> and <u>The History of Middle-earth</u> series. The giants in Tolkien books are similar to the type B giant above. Further comments are made regarding the sighting of a Tree-man in the North Moors by Halfast; the author speculates that this is a giant and not an ent (which is the general opinion).

"Tolkien, the Monsters, and the Critics: Back to BEOWULF" by Andy Orchard, pp. 73-84. The author gives examples of Tolkien's and other critics' views on <u>Beowulf</u>. The only surviving manuscript of <u>Beowulf</u> follows the Old English variant of <u>Letter of Alexandria to Aristotle</u> (both written by the same Christian scribe); both have the similar theme of pride and have had the author's spin on an earlier tales much like Tolkien has done, drawing from these sources.

"The Green Man, The Green Knight, and Treebeard: Scholarship and Invention in Tolkien's Fiction" by Verlyn Flieger, pp. 85-98. Tolkien's Treebeard through his evolution in <u>The Lord of the Rings</u> follows in the tradition of the Green Knight who, in turn, is very reminiscent of the pagan Green Man found in British architecture.

"Tolkien and Old Icelandic Literature" by Fredrik Heinemann, pp. 99-109. Components of Icelandic sagas are described and it is shown that Tolkien touches on some of these ideas. However, <u>The Hobbit</u> does not fall into these footsteps (although there are similarites found in the plot of <u>Volsunga saga</u>). <u>The Silmarillion</u> looks like a saga, but Tolkien reveals what is in the minds of his characters and gives away too much information to be considered in the vein of an Icelandic saga.

"Sægde se þe cuþe: J.R.R. Tolkien as Anglo-Saxonist" by Paul Bibire, pp. 111-131. *Tolkien's feelings towards philology is given metaphorically as Sméagol's searching for the roots of things. Tolkien felt that everyone has a "native language" which may not be his birth-tongue but one which is familiar on a different level. The histories of some languages and how they (although different) seem to follow the same change patterns over time, which makes one wonder if language is genetically programmed to change. This genetic view towards language might explain Tolkien's feelings towards a "native language". Tolkien felt that an "imaginative response" needed to be taken when trying to understand a long lost or ambiguous tale, The Homecoming of Beorhtnoth Beorhthelm's Son is such an example. Tolkien's attention to detail is well documented with his notes on the Finnesburh material and although he had a "wasted career", he provided his readers with a glimpse of Faerie.* 

"Sub-creation and Tolkien's Theology of Story" by Colin Duriez, pp. 133-150. The author believes that one of the uses of sub-creation to recombine the Christian (earlier, Greek) beliefs of nature and grace. Natural theology is held in good stead with the Roman Catholic church, but Tolkien uses it differently--through imagination rather than reason to find truths about God. Tolkien's elves are a metaphor for human culture and are, figuratively, after the Third Age a spiritual quality as it relates to Christianity (which Tolkien uses to reconcile nature and grace). In Tolkien's works there is a pre-Christian (pagan) belief and like the <u>Beowulf</u> poet, Tolkien tells his story through a Christian's eyes.

"Tolkien and the Unfinished" by Clive Tolley, pp. 151-164. The author shows how Tolkien took themes, characters and sub-plots of other works and tried to perfect them within his own work. Cynewulf's "earendel" is seen by Tolkien as personal name but its relationship to the sea is unknown. The author suggests that Tolkien tied this in with the story of Wade (from "Widsip" and Speght's edition of Chaucer) and his ship "Guingelot" to create a story from which each of these references might derive. The author moves on to Unferp, an enigmatic character from Beowulf, and his similarity to Gríma Wormtongue. Rider Haggard, who Tolkien read, seems to have influenced Tolkien greatly: Galadriel is an Ayesha figure (from She); Aragorn shows much in common with Ignosi from King Solomon's Mines; and, many sub-plot devices found in She and Allan are found in The Lord of the Rings.

"Technology and Sub-creation: Tolkien's Alternative to the Dominant Worldview" by David Llewellyn Dodds, pp. 165-186. Tolkien's feelings towards technology (in the light of "sub-creation") is examined in how it relates to human nature. Current thinking show that technology and man's use of it to change Creation causes man to believe that he is above the Creator. Man's will become the end all. Nietzsche and Tolkien are compared to show how each viewed man within Creation, which includes an example of how each interpreted music in relationship to Creation. A Second Reality can be created (for example, by Compte, Hegel or Marx) to overthrow Primary Reality and (contrary to sub-creation) is reflected in Tolkien's works, especially with the Melkor worship in Númenor. Sub-creation puts limitations on Man and causes him to acknowledge a Creator, God. This relationship is clearly shown by example in the creation of Dwarves by Aulë.

"Speculative Fiction and Ideology" by Keith Battarbee, pp. 187-192. One cannot read a book or see a film without putting a cultural gloss on the creator's work, independent of the creator's intentions. Tolkien may be so widely read across many different nationalities, religions and creeds because of the reader's need to find a place where heroism and dignity are the norm.

"By Stock or by Stone: Recurrent imagery and narrative pattern in <u>The Hobbit</u>" by Paul Bibire, pp. 203-215. *Tolkien uses cyclical themes, events and characters to progress the narrative of The Hobbit. Most of these theme have ties to some or all of the elements stone, wood, fire and water.* 

"Tolkien as a Post-War Writer" by Tom A. Shippey, pp. 217-236. The author compares the life and wartime experiences of White, Golding, Orwell, Lewis and Tolkien to show how these shaped their approach to the subject of evil in their works. And, as their views did not conform to the British literary culture at the time, they were derided or misunderstood in criticism and reviews.





Activities: It is the opinion of the innkeepers that this is the oldest Unquendor inn. It has held over 80 meetings which are held irregularly at the above address. On 20 August the smial held their Summermoot. During 1993 the group published "The Set of Five Cards" and "The Hobbittons" tape cassette featuring Tolkien's poetry set to music. The group's leader is famous for his pictures in the Beyond Bree calendars and Lembas. One of the reasons that Ar Caras is so very popular is because it developed during the years from a literary gathering into a 'hobbitic refuge', not hosting just Hobbits, but also Elves, Dwarves the occasional Ent, even Orcs and Nazgûl(!). And they all sing along with the Hobbitons, drink 'the best beer of the South Farthing', and enjoy the abundance of Hobbittic dainties and tidbits. In August, the group celebrated its own centenary, Ar Caras 100, held in the picturesque gardens of an old monastery, deep into the night singing at the bonfire. In 1995, the inn is planning a celebration of '10 years of Ar Caras'. 'Ar Caras' by the way means 'City of the King', so chosen because Nijmegen used to be the place where Charlemagne resided. Because Ar Caras is supposed to be one of the regional inns (as all inns are), the inn had a bit of a problem when people started coming from all over, so the group started the tradition of a Summermoot, held in a place where at least 25 people who want to visit Ar Caras are able. At every meeting, one of the frequent guests provides an 'introduction', a talk on a self-chosen Tolkien-related subject. Ar Caras hosts scholars and PhD's, top-managers and unemployed, 17 and 60 year olds: the discussions are getting better all of the time. Meetings are monthly.

Today two of the three founders still organize the smial evenings. Every last Friday of the month the smial is open. On the even month a subject is chosen by one of the founders or guests. This subject has something to do with roleplaying and, more often than not, Tolkien. Subjects vary from 'Do you like roleplaying for the same reasons as you like Middle-earth?' or 'Is MERP suited to Middle-earth?' or 'How would you play an elf from Mirkwood?' On the odd months we try to deal with the subject of the month before in a roleplaying game. Rivendell is still very much alive after four years, more than forty smial evenings and more than sixty different visitors!


De Staart van de Draak (Geeske Kruseman, Karel Doormanstraat 99, 5342 TK, Oss, The Netherlands)

The yearly celebration of Tolkien's Birthday Party was held on 3 January was held. Middle-earth dress was compulsory for all of the above occasions. A parade was organized through Fornost Erain (Stockholm, Sweden) on the first day of the Gates of Summer (Ascension Day).

Additional information: In the absence of the King, the constitution is upheld and the Forodrim are governed by the Grand Council, under the Law of the Forodrim. There are three estates: Commoners, Knights/Dames, Princes/Princesses. Members are required to take names, not necessarily from the legendarium. The calendar is according to the New Reckoning; the Year XXII of the Forodrim began on 18 March 1993. The newsletter, Medlemsbladet, contains mostly society related material including reports from banquets and guild activities and information about future events. Most Medlemsblad include a summary of what the Swedish press has written about Tolkien and related matters. Guilds are not sub-organizations in the usual sense, i.e., more or less independent organizations geographically apart from the main society, but in reality the main fora of activity within the Forodrim apart from the the monthly folkmoots and the feasts, and catering for the various special interests of its members. Thus they have no addresses as such, apart from the home address of whoever happens to be Guildmaster at the moment.


