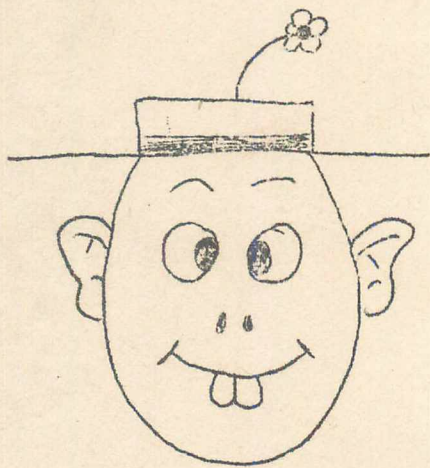
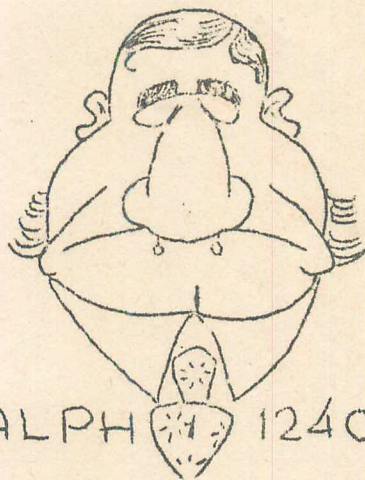


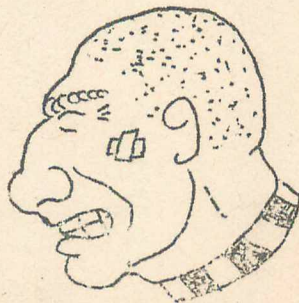

However, if it would interest you, I might also say that I have been writing stf since 1929, and in all that time have sold but eleven stories, and hope to write more. I have spoken".

Has attended all three conventions so far and expects to go to all. Waited ten yrs 1929-1939 before he had means to put out his own fanzine--FFF. Has been dealing in stf for over five years -- can safely say that he has had the biggest collection of any fan.

WARNER, HARRY, Dec. 19, 1922, 5'11", 115 lbs, doesn't wear glasses or spats. Fan record: started reading Amazing in 1933 which was followed almost immediately by Wonder and Astounding. Had a letter published in Astounding in 1936 which brought him many correspondents. Entered fandom in 1938; has published Spaceways, which has recently folded, since then and Horizons since 1939. Member NFFF, SFL, FAPA, SFneers, DFF and oodles of other things. Like baseball, reading plays, music and Li'l Abner. Has lived the quietest sort of life imaginable, introverted and ambitious to be left a fortune.

WASHINGTON, JR., RAYMOND, born Nov. 13, 1926. 5' 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", 126 pounds. Raym was born fat and primitive. Now he is thin and incurably intellectual. No pen name other than Raym. The more that he learns, the more he realizes that he knows nothing at all compared with what he doesn't know. Fond of animals, particularly dogs and cats. On the surface, he is sometimes coldly unemotional, or quick tempered.

WIDNER, JR., ARTHUR L. born in 1917, 15 feet tall, 1650 grams. Has been reading stf for fourteen years. Likes swimming, table-tennis, boogie-woogie, and food. Pen names are Yhos, Oil Bryant, Arthur Lambert (pro), Albert Woodward, Arlavi, Laitas, and O. Sewell. First interest can be traced back to Anderson and Oz; then Kipling and Verne. Brief connection with Brooklyn Reporter in 1935, was in CCC's from 1935 to 1938 developing muscles. Attempt to organize a fan club in Quincy in 1935 failed. Organized Stranger Club in Feb. 1940.  Started reading stf in 1931, entered actifandom in 1934 as a member of T.F.S. and T.F.S. Wrote stories before becoming a fan. Voted No. One Fan two years ago (only fan to beat 4sf) and still ranks No. Ten without even trying.
