GREETINGS! AND WELCOME to copy # 355 - first printing of the first edition of WHO'S WHO IN SF FANDOM - 1961!

Compiled and edited by LLOYD DOUGLAS BROYLES, Rt. 6 Box 453P, Waco, Texas. Copy rates - free to certain good folks, certain club members and a few will get review copies. OTHERS - 50¢.

Before starting an explanation is in order - PLEASE FOLLOW CLOSELY!

The name of each is listed first alphabetically and in all capitals, followed by complete address, birthdate, and occupation, and some few times in parenthesis the birthplace. The birthdate is given month - day - year (i.e.-February 3, 1931 is 2-3-31). The next items are clubs belonged or currently in which membership is held, where applicable in parenthesis any offices held, this includes official editorships of apa-groups. The letters "Pub.-" stands for publishes/published/ or had a hand in writing, correlating the fanzines listed. (I have underscored all names of fanzines, prozines or general issued magazines given). Following that comes a small (sometimes longer) listing of articles, stories, artcredits, with the titles given in quotation marks and where known the zine published in. The next items are, usually, two sets of numbers denoting date begun reading science fiction (and I use the term both for science fiction/fantasy/science romance) and date entered fandom. (On the questionnaire I asked how long on both of these questions and hereby beg forgiveness of anyone who did so as I translated all answers by subtracting from 1961 -- some few were most helpful in giving the year themselves). Next item begins "Attended" and delineates any and all conventions attended. The numbers "1 7/8, 3.75, 7.50 and 15.00"- are given in most instances as speeds available in tape recorders, in some few instances the make and 2 or 4 track information is listed. "Collects" is followed by a general listing with some few specific items also included. Notations of correspondence activities give generalities. (In one or two instances there are requests for more corresponders - will you consider?) The last item is enclosed in quotes and is mostly to be read as a statement of other interests or a more full explanation of ones activities not covered in the other places, such as amateur filming, sports, hobbies, likes, dislikes, etc. A few gave their phone numbers and these are put either with the name, address section or at least once given last.

I can do better and promise next year to be more careful in my correlation of answers. This has been a job of laborious love and comes to you hoping to find you still in fandom FOREVER.

The above explanation gives what would be a complete and full active fan. In most cases some of these items are blank and I did not put a negative notation in each entrant.
