Part I: Egoboo Ballot -

① Returning a ballot gets you an additional 25 points — so don't vote for yourself.

- ② Fill out the grid on the other side for the body of the ballot. The categories should be self-explanatory: overall zine quality, quality of mailing comments, ability to inspire mailing comments, visual spiffiness, interesting natter, and "roll your own." The last allows you to make up a reason to give an additional five points.
- ③ Name the *single issue* of a zine you think is best of the year. This is a vote for single, spectacular effort. Top vote getter is awarded an additional 5 points.

④ Name the top two on-going titles (or "George's zines" or "mike's zines"). This is a "body of work" vote. Top vote getter is worth 10 points; second place is worth 5 points.
