Edie & Joe stressed that the books were not necessarily the best SF ever written, but were highly influential in forming the various sub-genres grouped under the SF banner. Frankenstein was the first work to thoroughly explore the impact of modern technology on human beings; The War of the Worlds was the first influential alien invasion novel; The Time Machine, the first time travel novel; The Skylark of Space introduced interstellar travel and, with it, space opera; etc. It was very interesting and sparked much lively discussion during and after the formal presentation. Well done, Edie and Joe!




