On November 17, there was a Board meeting at Becky Peter's pad. Below is what we will be voting on at the next SFSFS meeting, Dec. 21. Please vote. Your vote counts for the future framework of the club; just think, you might change the rules for many generations of SFSFSers to come.

> South Florida Science Fiction Society Board of Directors Meeting 11/17/86

By-laws change:

Motion 1:

Revise the attendance requirements set in Bylaws I.7 (a) from six to twelve (12) successive meetings.

Motion 2:

(18) to twenty-four months. ALSO add to the beginning of the next sentence: "Upon request by the affected member," this provision may be waived...*

Motion 3:

Change By-Law II.2 to reflect the current Annual Meeting Schedule as approved by the Regular Membership. Corrected Bylaws II.2 should be changed to the "last meeting of the October-December" quarter.

Motion 4:

Addition to the Bylaws as III.1 (3), the ability for voting under the Robert's Rules that we are using.

Motion 5:

Add the following sentence to Article IV. 5: "The limit to

this set-aside will be \$3,000.00 or 35% of the budget from the previous convention, whichever is greater."

Operating Procedures

1: In accordance with Bylaw III.2, no later than the second regular montply meeting after his/her election, each officer must propose a Deputy for approval by the Board of Directors or by the Regular Membership. Only Regular Members may serve as Deputy to a SFSFS officer. Nomination of an absent person is inadmissable unless the written consent of the nominee is submitted to the presiding officer.

2. In accordance with Bylaw IV. 1, a Board Representative for a convention or major event (as defined by the Board) will be the Chairman of that convention or event. Should the Chairman already be on the Board, he/she will have to forfeit the existing Board position. The Board will then fill the empty Board position according to By-Law III.4. The number of appointed Board Representatives shall always remain less than the number of elected board members.

3. To conform to By-law Motion 5, if it is approved, the Treasurer will keep a separate accounting for each convetion run by the Society.

- When the set-aside exceeds the limits established, the a. Treasurer will notify the Board and transfer the appropriate amount to a Special Reserve holding account for use by the Society.
- These funds will be accumulated in the Special Reserve b. account for emergencies, to offset unexpected losses, to seed major new projects, or for other major needs. The use of these funds will be handled as a "serious matter" as described in the By-Laws.
- The Foard and the Society will NOT depend upon NOR use C. these funds for normal operating activities.

4. In accordance with By-Law IV. 8, the Chairman or head of each committee, task force, convention, major event, or other activity of the Society shall keep good and accurate records of such activity, including, but not limited to: budgets, receipts, expenses, attendance records, descriptions of projects, and minutes when necessary or directed by the Board.

- Revisions to Operating Procedure 21: 5.
- The Membership Directory should be published annually in a. the first quarter of the new membership year. b.
 - additions to be included in the Membership Directory: SFSFS Business Membership Form 1.

6. The Secretary shall compile and publish an annual calendar of activites required by the By-Laws, the Operating Procedures, or Board directions. It should also contain tentative schedules for regular meetings and programs, special events, SFSFS sponsored convetions, and any other SFSFS meeting that can be scheduled in advance. The first draft should be in the January issue of the Shuttle with a request for additional input from committee chairmen and members. The final schedule will be in the Membership Directory.

7. Addition to Operating Procedure 26: The Membership Directory Committee should also keep a new member questionnaire to be sent with the new member packet to identify interests, resources, etc., of new members.

- 8. SFSFS New Members should receive:
 - 1. Welcome letter from SFSFS Chairman
 - 2. Receipt for dues
 - 3. Membership Directory

4. Flyers on Tropicon and other SFSFS events, if available

5. SFSFS Shuttle, last issue

6. Membership Card, which qualify members for SFSFS business discounts.
