The last business meeting of the South Florida Science Fiction Society (SFSFS) was held on Sunday, September 13, 1987 at the Book Club in Lauderhill. 21 members and 11 guests attended. Judy Bemis reported that as of the date of the meeting, the current membership total was 89, including 5 Honorary, 32 Regular (including 16 Founding Regular), 46 General, and 6 Child Members. This total included new members Ray Herz and Dwight Douglas. The SFSFS treasury stood at \$1604.22, and the Tropicon treasury was \$3109.49.


