

9th International Conference on the Fantastic Comes to Dania

The 9th International Conference on the Fantastic in the Arts came to Dania, Florida March 16-20, after a long period of time during which the conference had visited other states. The conference brought such well-known writers as Peter Beagle, Stephen Donaldson, Brian Stableford, Brian Aldiss, Harlan Ellison, Octavia Butler, Tom Maddox, Justin Leiber, Joe Haldeman, editor David Hartwell, writer and scholar Kathryn Hume, and other writers, teachers, and attendees.

Special programs included a keynote address by Harlan Ellison, a scholarly address and luncheon with Kathryn Hume, films by Ellison (mostly from The Twilight Zone), and Beagle's The Last Unicorn. A program on computer graphics was presented by Donna Cox which showed graphics being used in such diverse subjects as grain studies and a hypothetical trip through a black hole.

Teachers from across the nation came to the conference to read papers on the fantastic in literature, films, and television. Subjects ranged from Dante to Stephen King. Many of the writers also read from their works---either those in progress or ones recently published.

One of the themes for the weekend was the censorship felt by authors when they tried to publish their work as expressed in Ellison's keynote address and also in an author's panel with Beagle, Stableford, Aldiss, Donaldson, Butler and Ellison. Each writer had a bad experience. Ellison related an experience when introductions to his stories were left out in England because British readers thought they were extraneous.

Donaldson concurred with Ellison, telling the audience about the publisher who wanted to break up the second book of his Thomas Covenant series (A Man Rides Through) into a third. He fought hard, but said he felt he was lucky to be able to keep the book in the manner he wanted it to be presented.

On a better note, the writers mentioned some good experiences with copy editors who were a help rather than a hindrance. It was thought

that if writer and editor worked as a team, the marketplace would be an easier place to work.

Awards were presented Saturday night with a speech by Guest of Honor, Peter Beagle. The conference concluded Sunday with a meeting of the International Association for the Fantastic in the Arts.

Who's Who at Two

On March 19th at 9 p.m., SFSFS members appeared at the *Dr. Who* event in Miami at Channel 2. The event featured Terry Nation of *Dr. Who* and *Blake's 7*; Eric Luskin, *Dr. Who* Producer; Jack Horkheimer of Channel 2's *Star Hustler*, and Channel 2's Mary Souder.

Prior to the event, there was a wine and cheese reception.

The program included taped interviews with Sylvester McCoy, the seventh doctor, questions and answers with Terry Nation, airing of *Time and the Rani*, the first McCoy episode, and interviews with local clubs, Omnicon and SFSFS being examples. Carol Gibson was interviewed about SFSFS.

The final total raised was \$19,300, which will go toward more SF programming on Channel 2. The event concluded sometime around 1:30 a.m.

TUCKER AWARD NOMINATION

A new award was instituted in 1985 to recognize the activities of that heretofore unsung group of people known as SF convention partiers. Every award must, of course, have a nickname; the official nickname of the Award for Excellence in Science Fiction Convention Partying is the "Tucker".

The first two years awards were sponsored and administered by the St. Louis in '88 Worldcon Bid Committee, and subsequent awards are administered by a related group. The awards will be nominated and voted on by members of Czarkon 6 (St. Louis' "adult relaxicon"), and the rest of SF party fandom via convention parties and any fanzines or SF Club newsletters willing to reprint this nomination form and/or the final ballot.

There are 3 awards: 1 each for SF Professional (writer, editor, or dealer), SF Artist, and SF Fan. Couples or groups are eligible as a single nominee. Any SF convention partier over the age of 21 is eligible, but nominees this year must be willing to attend the presenting convention if they win. Winners are not eligible for re-nomination in any category for a period of 5 years; losing nominees are eligible again the following year. The 1985 thru 1987 winners were:

The design of the physical award is a full bottle of Beam's Choice bourbon mounted on a base; the base has a plaque with the year, award name, and the winner's name. An instant tradition was begun in 1985: the winners received their awards full, but took them home from the convention empty (many self-sacrificing volunteers helped empty the awards).

To nominate someone for a 1988 Tucker Award, write their name (both names for a couple) and address opposite the applicable category on the form below, detach it along—the dotted line, and mail it to TUCKER NOMINATIONS, PO Box 1058, St. Louis, MO 63188. Photocopied, hand-printed, or typed equivalents of the nomination form are acceptable. If you don't know a nominee's address, and don't think the Award Committee will either, if possible please include on the back of the form or a separate sheet the name of a prominent SF person (whose address we CAN determine) who may know the nominee and might be able to give us an address. Your own name and address are requested, but not required, to further assist in tracking down unknown-to-us nominees.


