
### TROPICON MEETING




Farewell To:



CORNELL WILDE: Popular leading man of the 40's who also tryed his hand at directing. Ms Davis's genre films included: WHATEVER HAPPENED TO BABY JANE?, HUSH...HUSH SWEET CHARLOTTE, DEAD RINGER, THE NANNY, MADAME SIN (TUM), SCREAM, PRETTY PEGGY, BURNT OFFERINGS, RETURN FROM WITCH MOUNTAIN, THE DARK SECRET OF HARVEST HOME and THE WATCHER IN THE WOODS. Her last film, a Larry Cohen horror opus, has yet to be released.
