ROBERT SILVERBERG'S HOUSE IN FIRE: At approximately 4 am, Wednesday morning, a disastrous fire swept the third floor and attic of Robert Silverberg's house in the Riverdale section of the Bronx, The house, formerly the mansion of New York mayor Fiorello LaGuardia, suffered extensive damage on the upper floors, but little or none on the first two.

Silverberg's entire science fiction collection, FAPA and fanzine collection, extensive library of rare books, and research materials wase destroyed. Also partially destroyed were his Science Fiction Writers of America files, of which he is President.

Silverberg plans to rebuild the upper stories, and presumably rebuild his collections. While the books, in most cases, are replacable, the many memories and years that went into the original collection can never be replaced.

MARCH 68 FANTASTIC COVER DUPLICATES ANALOG COVER: The cover for the March 1968 issue of Fantastic, published by Ultimate publishing Co., is a close duplicate of the June

1963 Analog cover. When asked about this, Sol Cohen, publisher of Fantastic, related that all covers for Amazing/Fantastic are bought from Three Lions Agency, and are reprints of covers appearing on Italian of magazines. Kay Tarrant, Assistant Editor at Analog, reported that, although she was unaware of the similarity, "we like to know about these things." Presumably the Fantastic cover was done by an italian artist who copied the Analog cover; many italian of paintings are duplicates of american of covers.

WHO IS STEVE STILES?: Who is Steve Stiles? Irrefutable evidence leads me to believe that Stiles is the biggest hoax to be perpetrated on fandom since Carl Brandon. While Stiles has had many fanzines published, has appeared at many conventions, and has even won TAFF, the Post Office has returned mail addressed to him at his home address as "addressee unknown." Quite clearly, if an official agency of the USGovernment refuses to acknowledge his existence, Stiles does not exist!

Other program items included a dialogue between Ted White and Roger Zelazny, and a panel discussing the New Wave with Lin Carter, Andrew Porter, and Alexis Gilliland. Room parties were generally good, with endless supplies of booze, mixers, and dry ice. Baltimore is planning to bid for 1971 using the hotel they had for this BaltiCon, the Lord Baltimore. It looks to be a Good Thing, and they have my vote.
